5.1 Accessibility Coordinator Update

The Accessibility Officer presented the Committee with a complete review of the Accessibility Compliance corporate accomplishments, confirming compliance with the list of 2017 reporting questions provided by the Province of Ontario. B. Condie noted that in preparation for the completion of the report she circulated the appropriate City Staff per department/division to secure their feedback to the list of questions provided.

5.2 Communication, Employment and Public Awareness Working Group

Logo redesign: The Accessibility Officer met with the Manager of Communications, Cheri Davidson. Cheri advised that time does not allow exploration prior to year end, however she expressed that she does not wish to see a multitude of different logos out in circulation using the City Logo. Cheri agreed she would explore the thought of a City Logo approach where the titles of various committees could be included in the New Year. Instead of exploring the logo redesign immediately she suggested that the committee may wish to explore hiring a photographer to take high quality accessibility photos to use on banners to promote accessibility, creating a bank of photos available for various projects, presentations, etc.

A picture frame to house the 2017 Award Recipients is ordered and the picture will be displayed beside the award plaques prior to the end of this year.

The Working group will commence preparation for Accessible Meetings workshop presentations in January. C. Morrissey has shared a Canadian Hearing resource for conducting Hearing Accessible Meetings. The Accessibility Officer has shared the Ontario Municipal Social Services Association booklet on Conducting Accessible Meetings.

Councillor Strangway has agreed to read a prepared statement in Council on November 28th in recognition of the International Day of Persons with Disabilities.

The 2017 theme for IDPD is Transformation Towards Sustainable And Resilient Society For All.

The 2030 Agenda pledges to Leave No One Behind. Persons with disabilities, as both beneficiaries and agents of change, can fast track the process towards inclusive and sustainable development and promote resilient society for all, including in the context of disaster risk reduction and humanitarian action, and urban development. Governments, persons with disabilities and their representative organizations, academic institutions and the private sector need to work as a team to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Threshold marking tape will be available for spring.

5.3 Parks and Transportation Working Group

N. Price advised that the Transit Study will be presented to the Transit Advisory Board on Tuesday, November 21, 2017.

Mr. Price also noted that both the conventional and LIMO specialized transit service has seen a dramatic increase in ridership.

5.4 Built Environment Working Group

The working group has not met. The team lead Mr. Huskinson was not in attendance at the meeting.

5.5 Councillor's Update

Councillor Strangway noted that Council has adopted the Capital Budget for 2018 and that a number of items address accessibility.

He thanked Mr. Price and Ms. Morrissey for their presentation introducing the Assistive Listening devices that are now available for use by the public during Council meetings. Councillor Strangway also noted that a large budget has been set to renovate Council Chambers that will include many enhancements that will offer greater accessibility.

Dear Clerk,

As you know, under the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA), municipalities with 10,000 or more residents are required to have a Municipal Accessibility Advisory Committee. The role of the Committees is to advise council about the requirements and implementation of accessibility standards, review site plans, and perform other functions as specified in the AODA. There are approximately 140 Committees across Ontario, with approximately 180 municipalities represented. These Committees are our vital partners in creating an accessible Ontario.

Under the AODA, the Accessibility Directorate of Ontario must review the standards of the Act. Although not legislatively required, the Directorate believes that a fulsome review of Accessibility Advisory Committees is warranted at this time. Following my announcement at the recent Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO) conference, I am now pleased to inform you that the Directorate is moving forward with a consultation of the Accessibility Advisory Committees (including an online survey and focus groups).

This consultation will be conducted on behalf of the Directorate by The Strategic Counsel (a notable market research firm). The consultation, which will begin in January 2018, will be conducted over approximately five months. The goal of this consultation is to learn more about the work of Accessibility Advisory Committees, what conditions are required for them to be successful, and how the Directorate might better support Committees going forward.

If your municipality has an Accessibility Advisory Committee, you will be contacted shortly by The Strategic Counsel with more information on the upcoming consultation.

Comme vous le savez, en vertu de la *Loi de 2005 sur l'accessibilité pour les personnes handicapées de l'Ontario* (LAPHO), les municipalités de 10 000 habitants ou plus doivent être dotées d'un comité consultatif municipal de l'accessibilité. Le rôle de ces comités est de conseiller le Conseil sur les exigences et la mise en œuvre des normes d'accessibilité, d'examiner les plans d'implantation et d'exécuter d'autres fonctions précisées dans la LAPHO. On compte environ 140 de ces comités en Ontario, et environ 180 municipalités sont représentées. Ces comités sont nos partenaires essentiels dans la création d'un Ontario accessible.

En vertu de la LAPHO, la Direction générale de l'accessibilité pour l'Ontario doit examiner les normes de la Loi. Bien qu'elle n'en soit pas légalement tenue, la Direction estime qu'un examen complet des comités consultatifs de l'accessibilité est justifié pour le moment. À la suite de mon annonce à la récente conférence de l'Association des municipalités de l'Ontario (AMO), j'ai maintenant le plaisir de vous informer que la Direction procède à une consultation auprès des comités consultatifs de l'accessibilité qui comprendra des sondages en ligne et des groupes de discussion.

Cette consultation sera réalisé pour le compte de la Direction par The Strategic Counsel (une firme réputée d'études de marché). La consultation, qui débutera en janvier 2018, durera environ cinq mois. Le but de cette consultation est d'en apprendre davantage sur le travail des comités consultatifs de l'accessibilité, sur les conditions nécessaires à leur réussite et sur la façon dont la Direction générale pourrait mieux appuyer les comités à l'avenir.

Si votre municipalité est dotée d'un comité consultatif de l'accessibilité, vous serez contacté sous peu par The Strategic Counsel, qui vous donnera de plus amples renseignements sur la consultation à venir.
