3. Deputations

3.1 Ongoing Capital Projects Update - Jocelyn Gill, Supervisor, Capital Projects Delivery

Update was provided to committee regarding the renovations taking place at 180 Kent Street. The original heritage windows have been restored with the original glass and have been installed.

Door replacements to accommodate accessibility requirements to be completed on the north and south of building by end of August. Bylaw door to be replaced as well.

New windows to be installed on the north side of the building which is not heritage designated. They will not be double paned and will be more energy efficient.

The committee inquired about an earlier suggestion regarding restoring the original brick work by removing the paint at 180 Kent Street W. The Building manager is aware of request and will respond to the committee.

3.2 26 Francis Street Council Chambers - Jocelyn Gill, Supervisor, Capital Projects Delivery

Council chamber renovation permit is the top priority. Drawings of the renovation work to be undertaken were circulated to committee members (architectural and electrical drawings as well as type of fixtures).

A key aspect of these renovations is improvements for accessibility and acoustics. In addition, the restoration of plaster on the ceiling of the Council Chambers is being undertaken. The committee asked about the qualifications of the contractors given the potential for further damage to the plaster ceiling from vibration. The firm undertaking the repair of the plaster ceiling is a highly experienced company from Ottawa.

Wood doors - new paint and hardware.

There are time constraints. They hope to award to contractors in next few weeks with completion by Dec 3rd for inauguration.

Lighting fixtures are also being switched for LED fixtures but will replicate what is currently in place and introduce new valence fixtures that are compatible with heritage character of the Chambers.

3.1 Heritage Awards Sub-Committee

Update on plan of action for the awards ceremony on September 18.

The awards ceremony will take place on September 18th beginning at 12pm. Judges are: S. Peeken, D. Illman, G. Scott.

Director Marshall confirmed there would be funds available for a reception. The budget for the committee is now included in the Arts, Culture and Heritage budget. Current expenses are: \$200 (approximately) for plaques, \$250 for refreshments. The committee is anticipating around 35 attendees for the ceremony.

There could potentially be presentation of 1 plaque to the owner 3 Kent Street. D. Soule to contact other owners to see if they want their plaques presented to them in public at the awards ceremony or not.

Committee would like to consider de-designating the pavilion at 72 Francis Street in Fenelon Falls as there is not much of the original gazebo left but cannot find too much information regarding it. Committee members pointed out that the address on the by-law for this gazebo may be incorrect since there is another

historically note-worthy gazebo in Fenelon Falls. There is a little white gazebo with a handmade plaque on it that members feel is the correct gazebo to be designated. No changes are to be made to 72 Francis Street until more information is found.

An error was made at time of amalgamation that ended up incorrectly listing the General Store at 973 Eldon Road in Oakwood. It was recently discovered that it is the antique store across the street from it located at 977 Eldon Road that is the designated building. The property owners will be notified by staff.
