5. New Business

5.1 Update Textile Recycling Research

Waste Management staff shared the results of research into alternatives for a textile recycling program for the City. Research indicates that other municipalities recommend going with charitable organizations rather than private companies. Curbside collection, bin drop-off or a combination of both was discussed. Task Force asked that staff look further into a bin textile recycling program at each landfill.

5.2 No-Cost Drop off Waste Numbers

Waste Management staff highlighted parts of the report going to Council. Points mentioned were the loss of tipping fees, and the difficulty comparing 2017 numbers with 2018 numbers due to measurement methods and new clear bag program in 2017. Task Force requested that final reports be in place for the 2018 pilot before making any decisions on the continuation of the program.

5.3 Mattress Update

Staff presented an update on the mattress recycling program, which started on September 10. The program has been well received and is running smoothly so far. Mattresses will be recycled at Recyc-Mattress Inc. and are being transported by a local hauler. Modifications will be made as necessary.

5.4 Clean Wood Update

Staff reports that the clean wood recycling program is very successful. Location has been changed to a bin at the saw tooth in order to minimize handling. Contract has been awarded to chip the clean wood. A better estimate of quantity will be available once the first material is chipped. Chipped material will be combined with sand for cover material.

- -Ongoing issue that some residents still not satisfied with the leaf and yard curbside and the free quantities at the landfill.
