3.1 Healthy Environment Plan - Chris Marshall

C. Marshall, Director of Development Services provided an update on the progress of the Healthy Environment Plan. Mr. Marshall reported that he met with Denise Williams and Ron Taylor to discuss next steps with the Healthy Environment Plan.

An internship with a Trent University student will be offered to help implement the Healthy Environment Plan.

Next steps include:

- Background research
- Research best practices in other communities
- Survey and interview stakeholders (City staff and community members)
- Identify City staff and community stakeholders for each theme/program area and build consensus on the implementation schedule
- Seek funding for various program initiatives
- Construct a governance structure for the future of the Healthy Environment Plan
- Prepare a presentation for Council

Members discussed the role of CKLEAC and the possibility of developing a sub committee similar to Bee City, that could meet, report to CKLEAC and then to the City.
