#### 5. OTHER NEW BUSINESS

#### 5.1 Curbside Collection Study & Staff Report

The final draft of 'Investigation of Options for Efficient Curbside Collection in the City of Kawartha Lakes' report prepared by Reclay StewardEdge was circulated to the committee for review. Staff outlined the results of curbside audits, municipal consultation and the public survey that was completed. Program analysis was reviewed with overall recommendations. An update was also provided on proposed new blue box legislation as this will directly impact future municipal curbside services.

#### 5.2 Mattress Recycling Staff Report

Staff outlined the rationale and recommendations for proposing a 19 month mattress recycling program to start June 1, 2018. This program will launch at Lindsay Ops landfill with potential expansion to other landfills. MOECC has already provided written approval to support this pilot. The savings to divert mattresses exceeds the operational costs therefore, staff recommendation is to move forward.

#### 5.3 Update on Operation of the Flare and Generator

The Operations Supervisor updated the committee that it has been determined that the main breaker to the flare and generator system has blown. MOECC has been notified of this occurrence. Staff are working with Comcor to find replacement parts immediately to complete repairs and have the system back online. Further updates will be provided as available.

#### 5.4 Update on the Cost Share Allocation of the Generator

C. Appleton spoke to Councils resolution at the September 26 meeting for staff to determine a proportionate percentage for cost and revenue allocation from the generator to both the general tax levy and water user rate budgets. Staff confirmed that this allocation is being determined and that some additional metering may be required.
