That the speed limit of Ballyduff Road from a point 250m east of Lotus Road to a point 810m west of Lotus Road be posted at 50 km/h; and

That the speed limit of Lotus Road from Ballyduff Road to a point 400m north of Ballyduffy Road be posted at 50 km/h; and

That the necessary by-laws for the above recommendations be forwarded to Council for adoption; and

That the Mayor and Clerk be authorized to execute any documents and agreements required by the approval of this decision.

Background:

Residents issued complaints in regards to speeding on Ballyduff Road through the Hamlet of Lotus.

Lotus is a built-up area along Ballyduff Road and Lotus Road consisting of 19 residential lots surrounded by agricultural land. The roads are unposted for speed.

There is a reverse curve (s-curve) running through the Hamlet of Lotus on Ballyduff Road.

A map can be seen in Appendix A.

Rationale:

Being unposted for speed, a reasonable driver could be approaching the reverse curve and the built up area at 80 km/h which is not an appropriate speed. Warning signs for the reverse curve are not currently installed which present a hazard in this unilluminated area. Particularly when there is no speed posting.

In keeping with CKL practices with speed postings in built-up areas and considering the reverse curve, a speed limit of 50 km/h is recommended on Ballyduff Road in the Hamlet of Lotus. Although the need is not as pressing on Lotus Road due to low volumes, a speed limit of 50 km/h is recommended on Lotus Road in order to keep the Hamlet congruent for speed.

Even with a speed reduction in place, it is recommended that warning signs for the reverse curve be installed following the Ontario Traffic Manual requirements for placement.

As a result of the justification review carried out by staff, it is recommended that the speed limit of <u>Ballyduff Road from a point 250m east</u> of Lotus Road to a point 810m west of Lotus Road and the speed limit of Lotus Road from Ballyduff Road to a point 400m north of Ballyduff Road be posted at <u>50 km/h</u> by way of an amendment to Schedule "D" (Highways with a Speed Limit of 50 km/h) of By-law 2005-328.
