We are and continue to be successful in our recruitment efforts.

Family Physician Recruitment Fourteen Years Later

In 2003 there were 28 family doctors in CKL

 KLHCI has recruited 36 family doctors in total with five opting to work full-time at RMH

Now there are 41 family doctors in CKL

Benefits to CKL from KLHCI Partnership

- 36 family doctors have been recruited to CKL since 2003
- Sufficient primary medical care contributes significantly to a healthier community
- Access to primary medical care for employees is an important criteria for new companies/industry to move into CKL
- Access to primary care for all citizens is important for the continued growth of the ratepayer base
