BY-LAW 2017 -

A BY-LAW TO AMEND THE TOWNSHIP OF FENELON ZONING BY-LAW NO. 12-95 TO REZONE LAND WITHIN THE CITY OF KAWARTHA LAKES

File D06-17-010, Report PLAN2017-024, respecting Part Lot 4, Concession 10, geographic Township of Fenelon, identified as 1435 County Road 36 – INVERLOCHY CAPITAL GROUP LTD.

Recitals:

- 1. Section 34 of the *Planning Act* authorizes Council to determine the appropriate zoning categories and provisions assigned to land.
- 2. Council has received an application to amend the categories and provisions relating to a specific parcel of land to prohibit residential use and prohibit the existing buildings from housing livestock.
- 3. A public meeting to solicit public input has been held.
- 4. Council deems it appropriate to rezone the Property.

Accordingly, the Council of The Corporation of the City of Kawartha Lakes enacts this By-law 2017-__.

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- 1.01 <u>Property Affected</u>: The Property affected by this by-law is described as Part Lot 4, Concession 10, geographic Township of Fenelon, City of Kawartha Lakes, 1435 County Road 36.
- 1.02 <u>Textual Amendment</u>: By-law No. 12-95 of the Township of Fenelon is further amended to add the following section to Part 8:
 - "8.3.21 AGRICULTURAL EXCEPTION TWENTY ONE (A1-21) ZONE

Despite section 8.1, on land zoned "A1-21" residential uses are not permitted and the buildings existing on the date of the passing of this by-law may not be used to house livestock."

1.03 <u>Schedule Amendment</u>: Schedule 'A' to By-law No. 12-95 of the Township of Fenelon is further amended to change the zone category on a portion of the Property from Agricultural (A1) Zone to Agricultural Exception Twenty One (A1-21) Zone for the land referred to as 'A1-21', as shown on Schedule 'A' attached to this By-law.
