

What is a disability?

- A physical or mental condition that limits a person's movements, senses, or activities.
- Disabilities may be <u>cognitive</u>, developmental, <u>intellectual</u>, <u>mental</u>, <u>physical</u>, <u>sensory</u>, or some combination of these.
- It substantially affects a person's life activities and may be present from birth or occur during a person's lifetime.


