Background:

Staff has received requests for the installation of stop signs in a particular development in the northeast end of Oakwood. This subdivision appears to have been developed in the late 1970's or early 1980's. Staff has found no stop control by-law on record.

Rationale:

The T-intersections of Albert Street and Grant Drive, and the two T-intersections where Grant Drive meet Brenda Boulevard currently have no stop control at any approach. A key map can be seen in Appendix A.

Although the Highway Traffic Act has provisions for uncontrolled intersections, conflicts can occur and it is not best practice to leave an intersection uncontrolled in a semi-urban like environment.

The purpose of a stop sign is to control right-of-way conflicts. Installing a single stop sign at the T at each intersection would alleviate potential conflict.

As a result of the justification review carried out by staff, it is recommended that stop signs be installed at the T-intersections of Albert Street and Grant Drive, and the two T-intersections at Brenda Boulevard and Grant Drive.

Other Alternatives Considered:

Four temporary stop ahead warning signs with "new" sign above (should be in inventory from previous all-way stop installations)
