Bill 68 - Background

 Bill 68, Modernizing Ontario's Municipal Legislation Act received Royal Assent on May 31, 2017, amending the Municipal Act, 2001 (Schedule 1), Municipal Conflict of Interest Act (Schedule 3), Municipal Elections Act,1996 and minor changes to other acts (Schedule 4).

Bill 68 - Impacts

- Conflict of Interest, in writing and registry
- Council/employee relations, required policy
- Meetings of council, definition, permitting electronic participation
- Codes of Conduct, update
- Complaint process, establish
- Integrity Commissioner, appointment and powers
- Pregnancy & parental leave for Council members

Bill 68 – Integrity Commissioner

- Appoint an Integrity Commissioner by March 1, 2019
- The role of the IC will be to report to council on the:
 - Application of the code of conduct to members of council;
 - Application of any procedures, rules or policies governing the ethical behaviour of members of council;
 - Application of the Municipal Conflict of Interest Act; and
- If requested by members of council advise respecting their obligations under the Municipal Conflict of Interest Act

Bill 68 – Procedural By-law

- Last amended September 2018
- Amendments Required
 - Pregnancy and parental leave
 - Process for addressing the investigation report
- Options
 - Electronic participation

Code of Conduct - Council

- Last updated November 2016
- To be reviewed by Council, within 1 year following the election
- Input by the Integrity Commissioner
