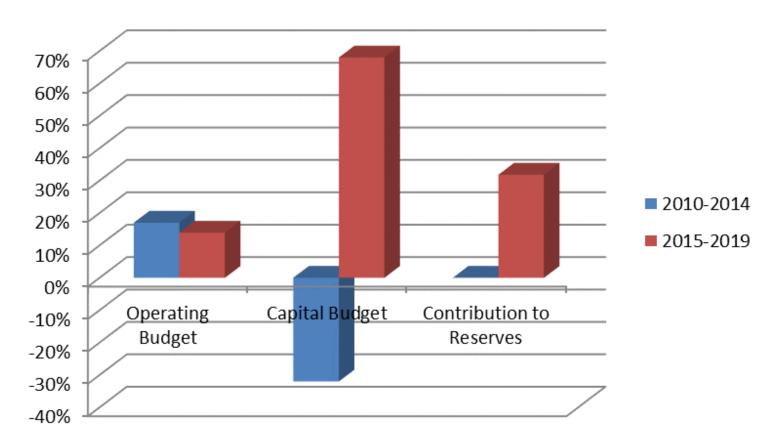

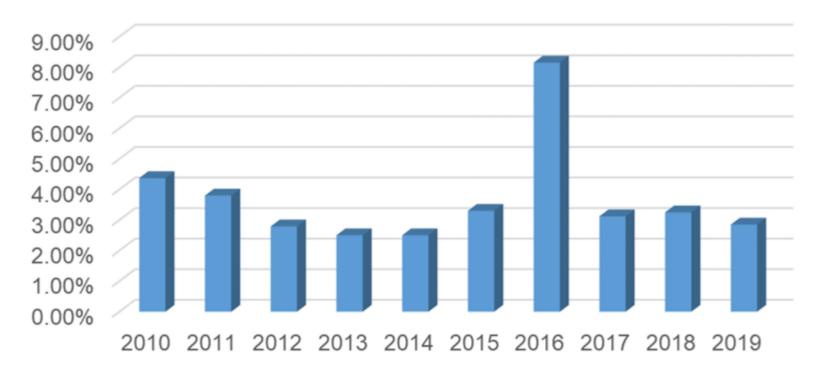

10 Year Trend of Tax Levy Increases

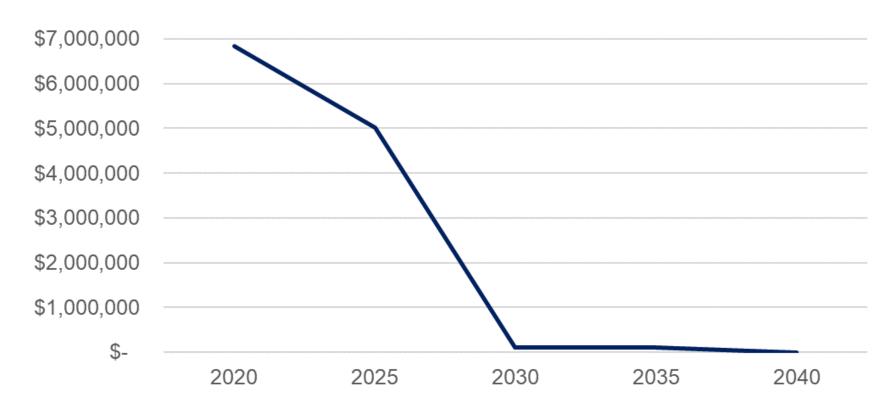

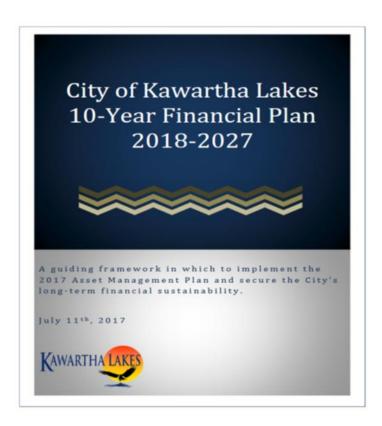


Tax Levy Supported Debt Payments

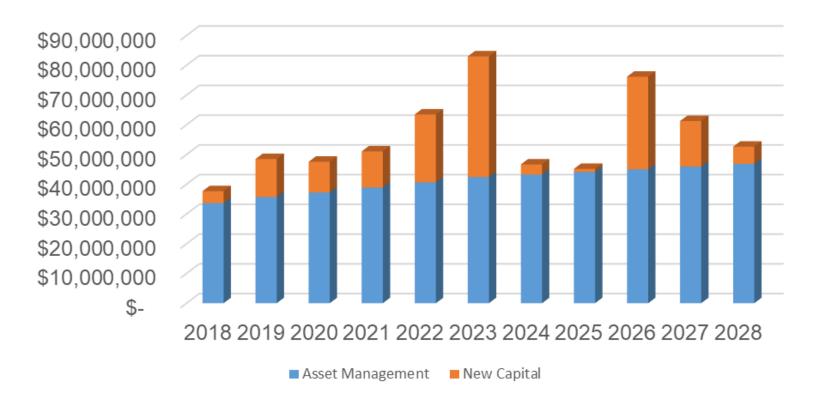

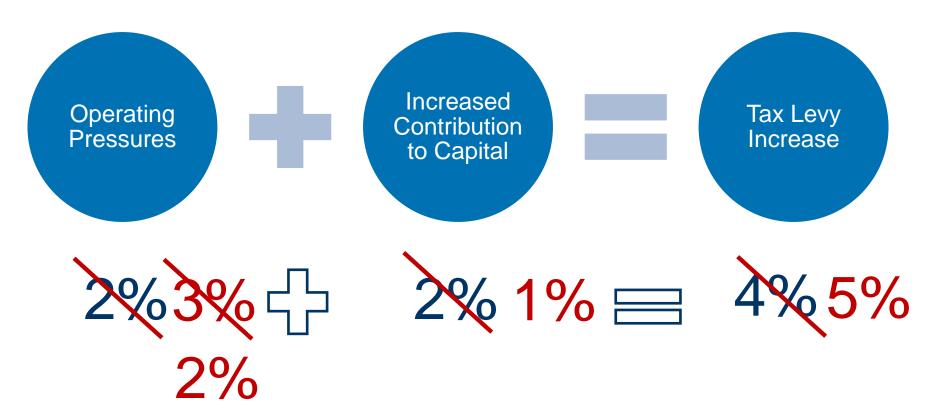
Annual Cost to Operate +/- \$200 Million



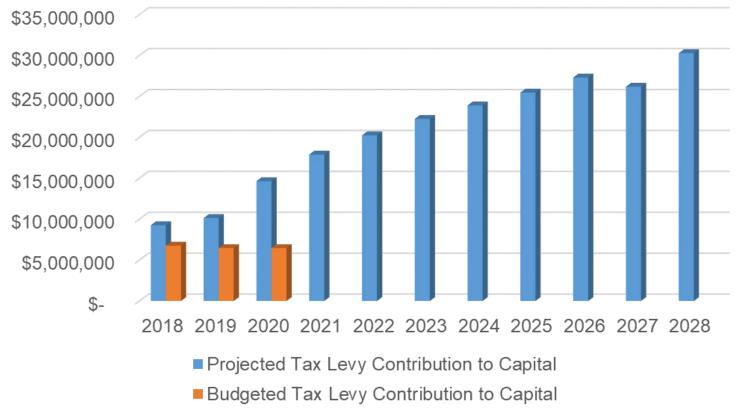

Operating

- delivery of 200+ day-to-day services
- +/- 50% tax levy supported

Water and Wastewater

- delivery of safe drinking water and treatment of wastewater
- user fee supported

2020 Budget

Special Projects

- one-time in nature
- do not result in the creation of or improvement to an asset
- primarily tax levy supported

Capital

- one-time in nature
- result in the creation of or improvement to an asset
- primarily funded from tax supported reserves

Provincial Funding Updates:

Ontario Municipal Partnership Fund (OMPF) support will continue for 2020

Paramedic Funding will continue for 2020 although not anticipated to fully fund 50% of operating requirements

Provincial Funding Updates:

Child Care funding has been reduced from 100% to 80% for 2020, with further reductions expected for 2021 and 2022

Ontario Works funding reductions anticipated to be announced in Q4 2019

Provincial Funding Updates:

Long Term Care capital funding reductions

Small Business Enterprise Centre grant and program delivery funding reductions

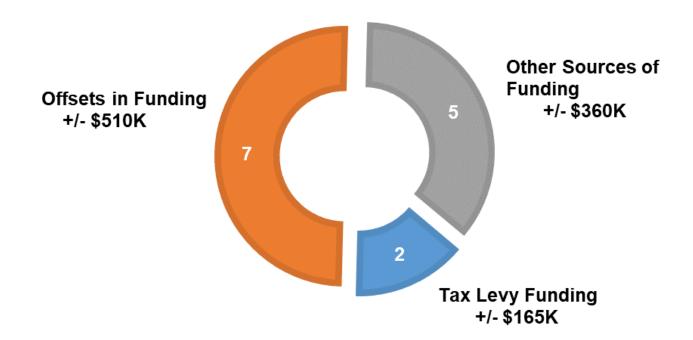

2020 Proposed Capital Budget

- Proposed capital budget currently exceeds available funding
- Staff are working to align capital budget with funding
- Prioritization of projects will be required

2020 Proposed Special Projects Budget

- Projects previously included in the Operating Budget
- During 2019 budget deliberations, Council requested these projects be captured under a separate budget for 2020
- The Special Projects budget will be included in the proposed 4% tax levy increase

2020 Proposed Water and Wastewater Budget

 Water and wastewater budget is fully supported by user rates

10 year financial plan projected a 3% increase in user rates for 2020

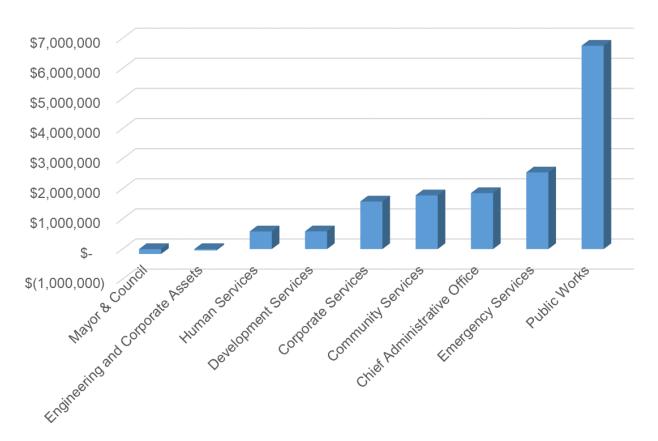
Proposed budget will align with the plan

Council Resolution for 2020 Budget

On June 11, 2019, Council approved:

- That all external City Agencies and Boards, funded in whole or in part by the tax levy, be advised and notified that the City's funding level for 2020 will not exceed the 2019 contribution level; and
- That staff be directed to bring forward 2 proposed budgets for 2020.
 - As per the long term financial plan approved by council.
 - 0% tax support operating budget increase over 2019 from each department.

2017 to 2019 Budget Increase



Proposed budget will align with the financial plan at 4%

Reduction to 0% will require service level cuts and/or capital program reduction of approximately \$4 million

- Resolutions of Council included in the 4%
 - Integrity Commissioner
 - Victoria Manor debt repayment forgiven
 - Construction and Demolition Recycling Program
 - Mattress Recycling Program
 - Federal Gas Tax funding for Roads (\$2M)
- Decision Units are not included in the 4% proposed budget

Next Steps:

Update the Financial Plan with an annual 3% tax levy increase

Update the Financial Plan to include Provincial funding changes
