March 27 culvert frozen & no water going thru but still flowing thru the ditch. On March ²⁹~~27~~ we had a rain day & the culvert started to run.

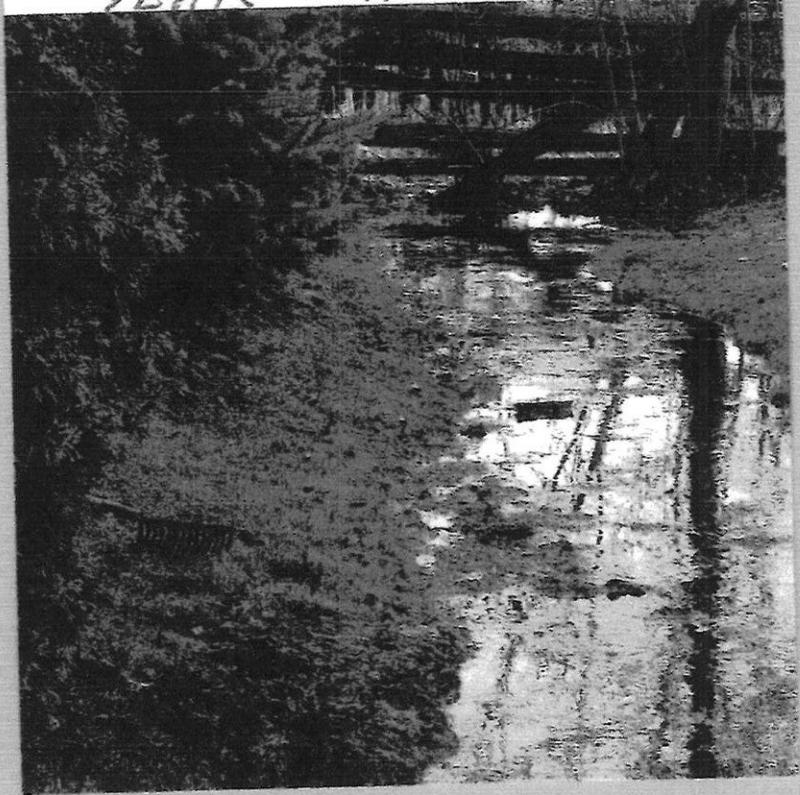
My neighbours across the street have also experiences flooding this year.

Dear Mrs. Jackson,

We have received your correspondence dated October 18, 2016 with regard to your drainage concerns on your property at 22 Alma St. N., Omeme, Ontario.

Public Works Staff have reviewed your concerns numerous times over the past several years, most recently in May of 2016. At that time Staff surveyed and obtained elevations of the area in question, and found that the culverts are all set at the proper elevations. Staff noted that any change in elevation or lowering of the culverts would increase the size and depth of the pond, therefore compounding the issue. It was also observed that your property is approximately 2 feet lower than ~~*~~ both the outlet and inlet culverts.

Staff have met with both yourself and owners of neighbouring properties to discuss these concerns. The properties in question lie on a natural waterway or historical creek that exists on private property. To improve the water flow on private property, neighbouring property owners may choose to clear the brush and debris on each property. This would assist with some of the run off, but ponding would still naturally occur due to the lower elevations of private property.

We trust this will reaffirm the City's findings with regard to your concern.
