Provincial State of Emergency

- Remains in effect until at least May 12
- Previously issued emergency orders remain in effect until at least May 6
- Additional orders and directives issued regularly
- Released "A Framework for Reopening our Province" (April 27, 2020)
- Federal/Provincial supports to municipal recovery unknown at this time

City Financials

- 2020 Budgets revisited and under review
- Decrease in revenue and users fees
- Physical distancing, PPE requirements, limited public access have changed service delivery
- Staffing layoffs & redeployments, and reduced operating & capital spending implemented

Immediate Local Recovery Relief

- Deferred interim and final 2020 tax payment due dates by 60 days
- Waived penalties and late charges associated with utility payments after due dates
- Monitoring cash flow and reviewing our financial position actively and regularly
