

### **Bill 68**



- Bill 68 Modernizing Ontario's Municipal Legislation Act, 2017
  - Amendment to Section 270 of the Municipal Act
  - In force and effect on March 1, 2019
  - Requires all municipalities to adopt and maintain policies to protect and enhance the tree canopy and natural vegetation
- Compliance with Bill 68 tree canopy requirements is not one size fits all

### **Review of Compliance Approaches**



- What tools other municipalities use:
  - By-law that confirms Official Plan addresses the requirements of Bill 68
  - Tree Preservation By-law / Tree Cutting By-law / Tree Conservation By-law
  - Forestry Master Plan
  - Grants / incentives for tree planning
  - Municipal sustainable management practices
  - Natural Heritage System Study
