## **2019 Surplus**



#### **2019 Surplus**



- The City recognized a \$3 million surplus at the end of 2019
- Council meeting of September 15, 2020 Council approved transferring the 2019 surplus to a contingency reserve
- Special Council meeting of December 1, 2020 Council further directed that the \$3 million be used for the purpose of funding community, economic, and corporate pandemic recovery initiatives

#### **2019 Surplus**



- To date, Council has approved the use of the \$3 million 2019 surplus for:
  - Reconstruction of Colborne Street, Fenelon Falls \$1,800,386
  - Replacement and Upgrade of Boat Launches: Head Lake, Elliott Falls, and Coulson Park \$115,000
  - 50/50 Community Program \$80,000
- This leaves approximately \$1 million in funding available for further pandemic recovery initiatives
- Two additional initiatives will be presented to Council January 28



# 2020 Budget



### **2020 Financial Overview**



- The Province declared a State of Emergency related to the pandemic on March 17, 2020
- In response to that State of Emergency, and a subsequent local state of emergency declaration, the City suspended all non-essential services temporarily
- June 2020, Council provided staff to target a zero deficit at year end

### **2020 Financial Overview**



- To date, the City has received +/- \$5.8 million in pandemic relief from upper levels of government
- Note the above funding is to cover all pandemic related costs / lost revenue for <u>2020 and 2021</u>
- The 2020 impact of the pandemic for the City is in excess of \$5 million
- Staff are anticipating a similar result for 2021, depending on the duration
- City is anticipating additional targeted support (ie Long Term Care and Paramedics)

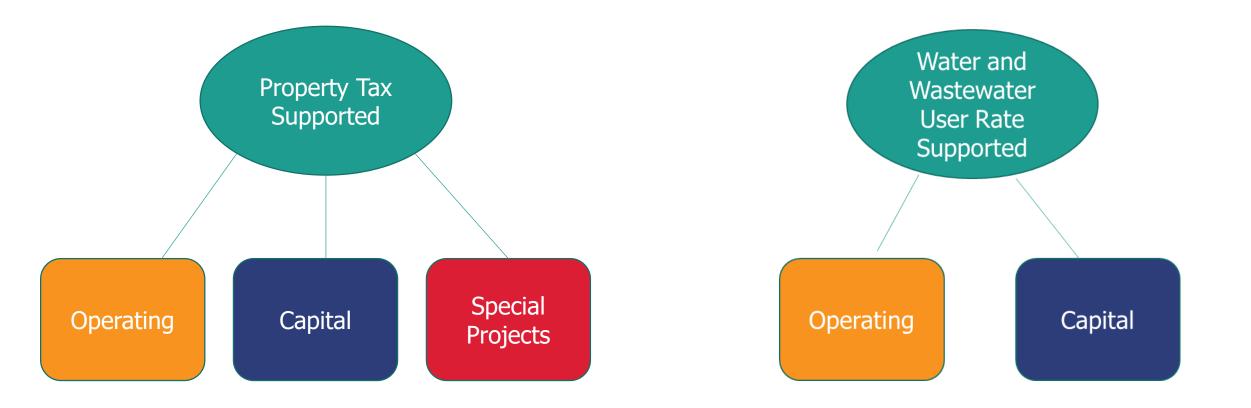

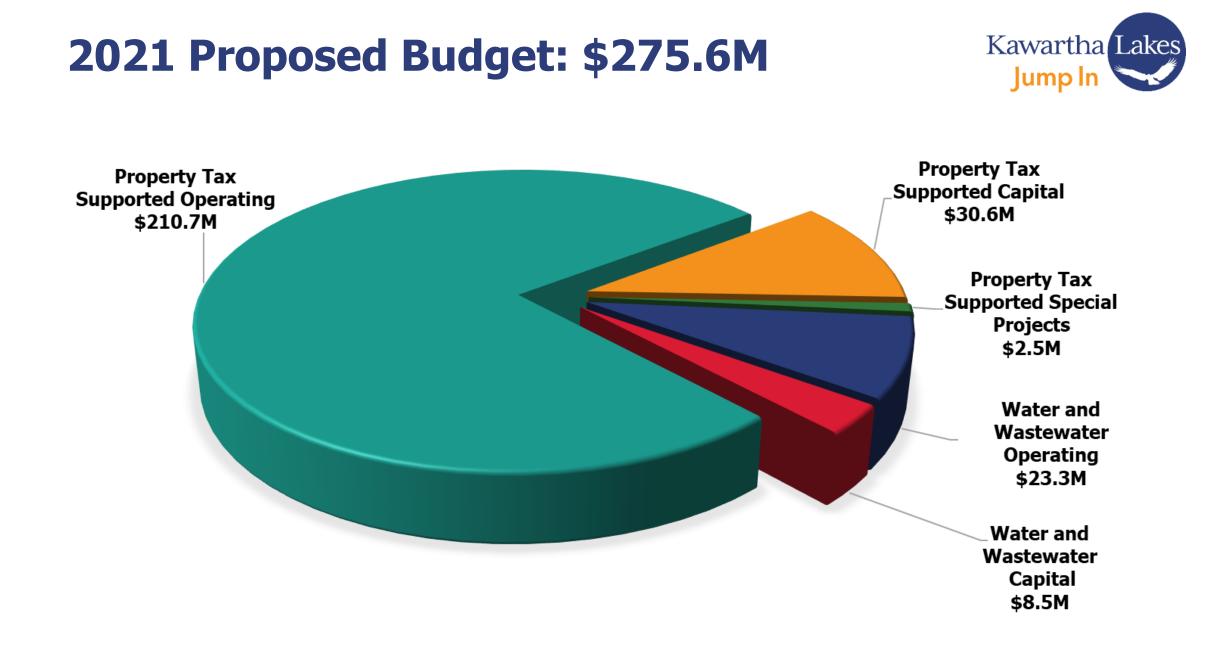

### **2021 Approved Capital Budget**

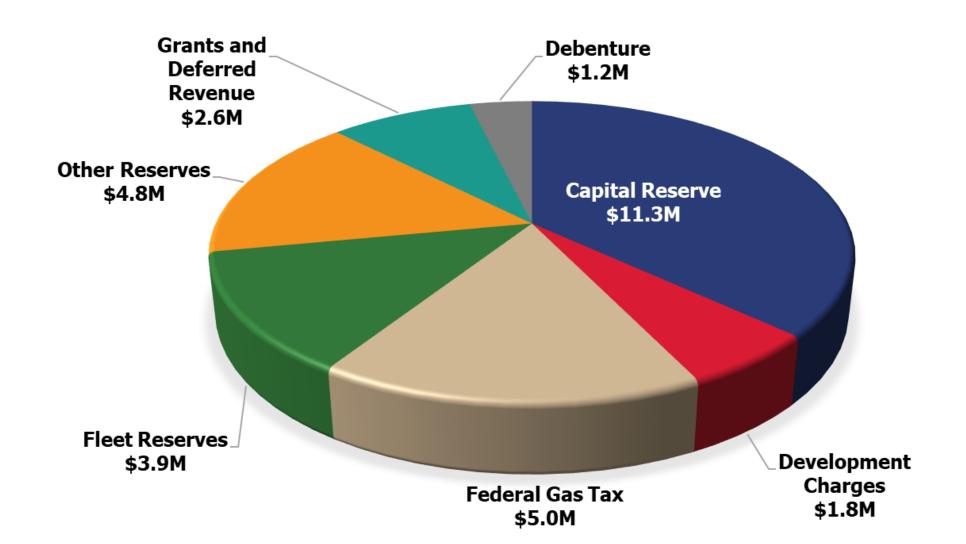


- Due to the pandemic, a number of 2020 capital projects were deferred
- Many of these projects commenced in late 2020 with anticipated completion in 2021
- With several projects still outstanding, and the uncertainty of the continued impact of the pandemic on the City's financial and human resources, a smaller than usual capital program was approved

- The Capital budget was approved on December 1, 2020
- Highlights of the budget include:
  - Reconstruction or resurfacing of 122 km of roads
  - Kent Street reconstruction continuation
  - Fenelon Falls downtown reconstruction

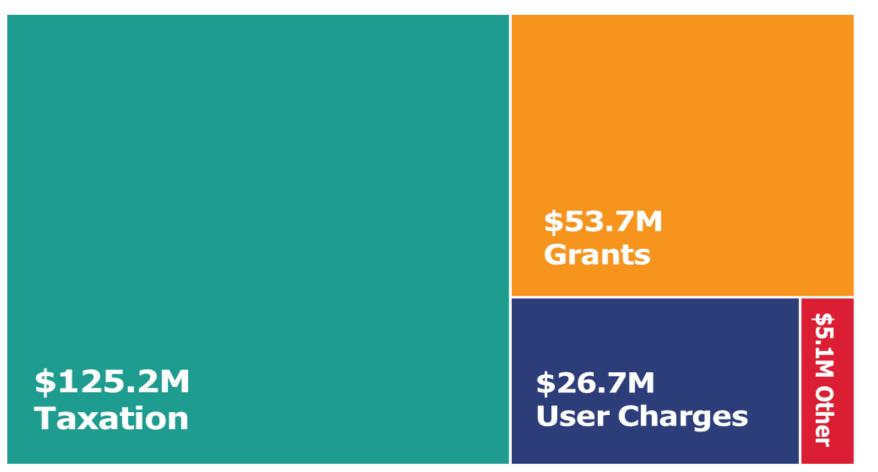

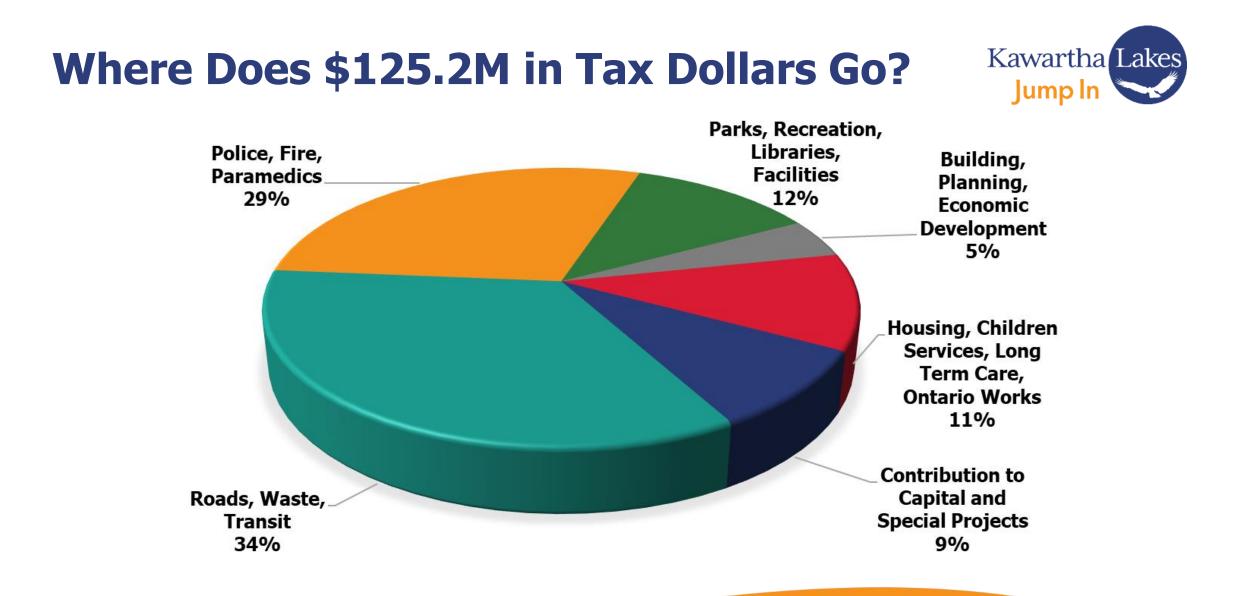

#### **2021 Operating Budget - Revenue**





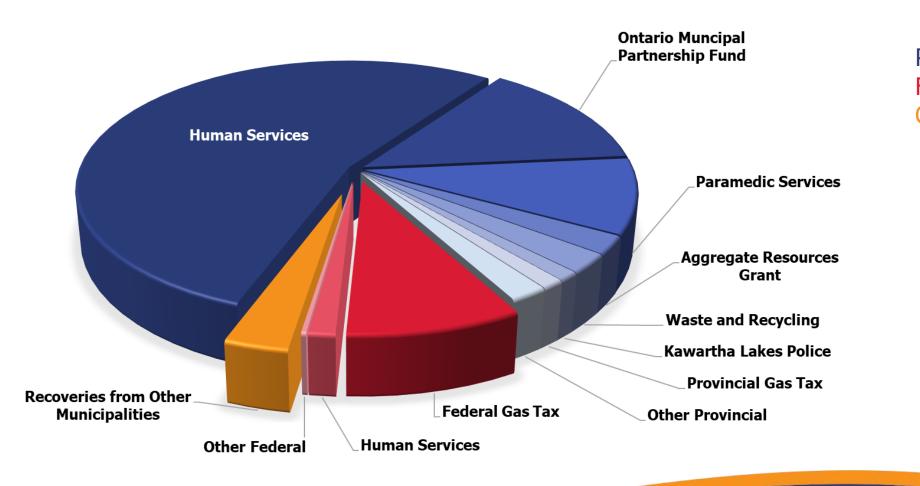

### **2021 Special Projects**



- 2021 is the second year of the Special Projects budget
- Special projects are generally one-time in nature:
  - Plans and studies
  - Technology
  - Maintenance and Repairs
- These costs were previously included in the Operating Budget
- Commencing in 2020 Council directed staff to create a separate budget for transparency

Highlights of the Special Project budget include:

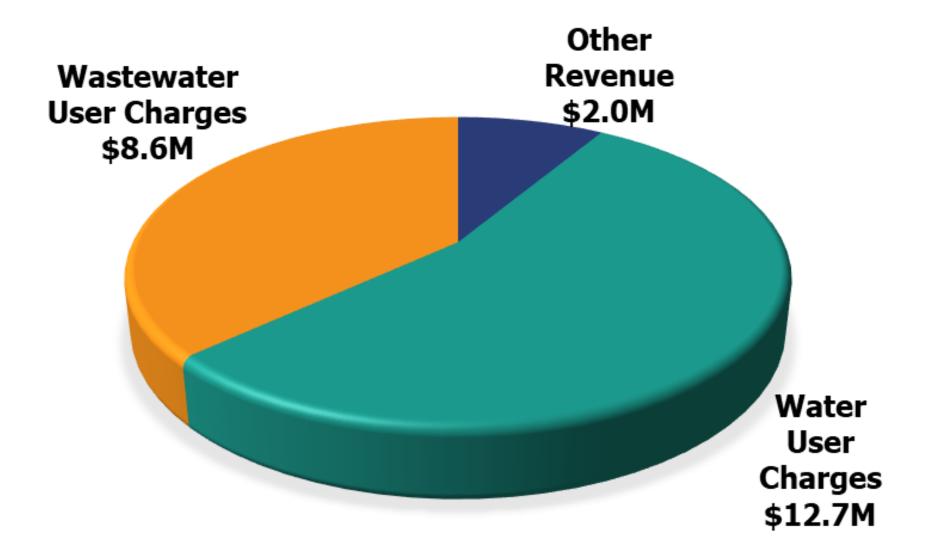
- Continued investment in mobile broadband initiative with Eastern Ontario Rural Network (EORN)

- Ongoing repair and maintenance of facilities and parks



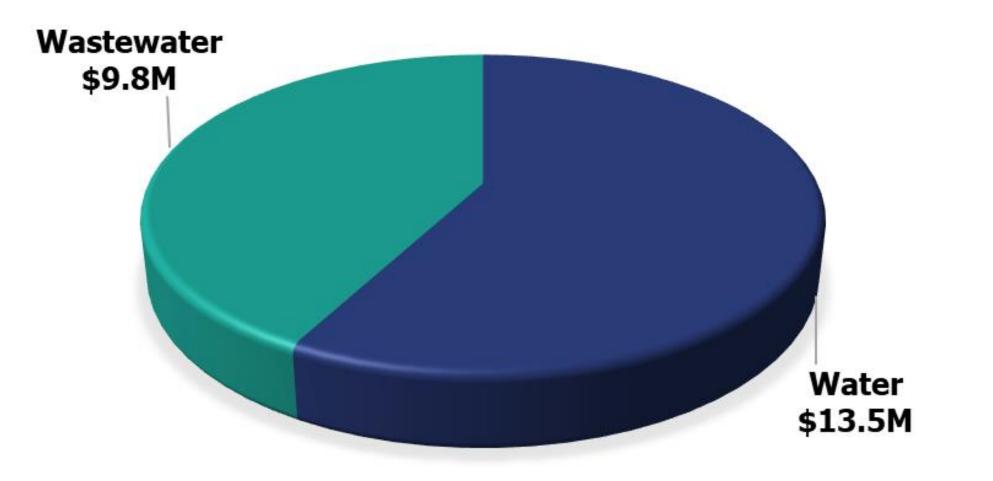
# Water-Wastewater Budget Kawartha Lakes



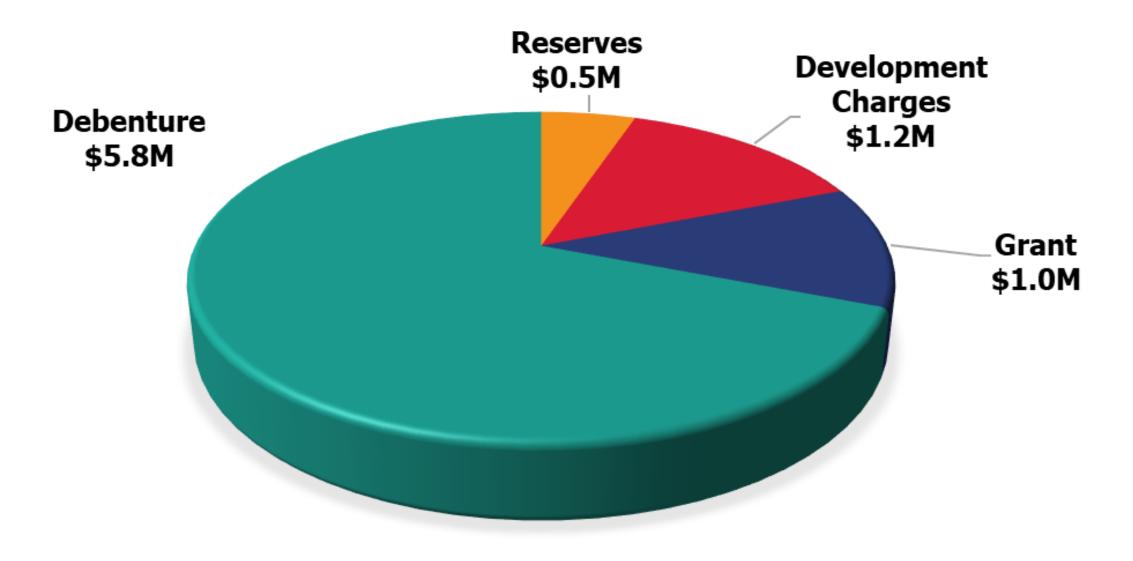


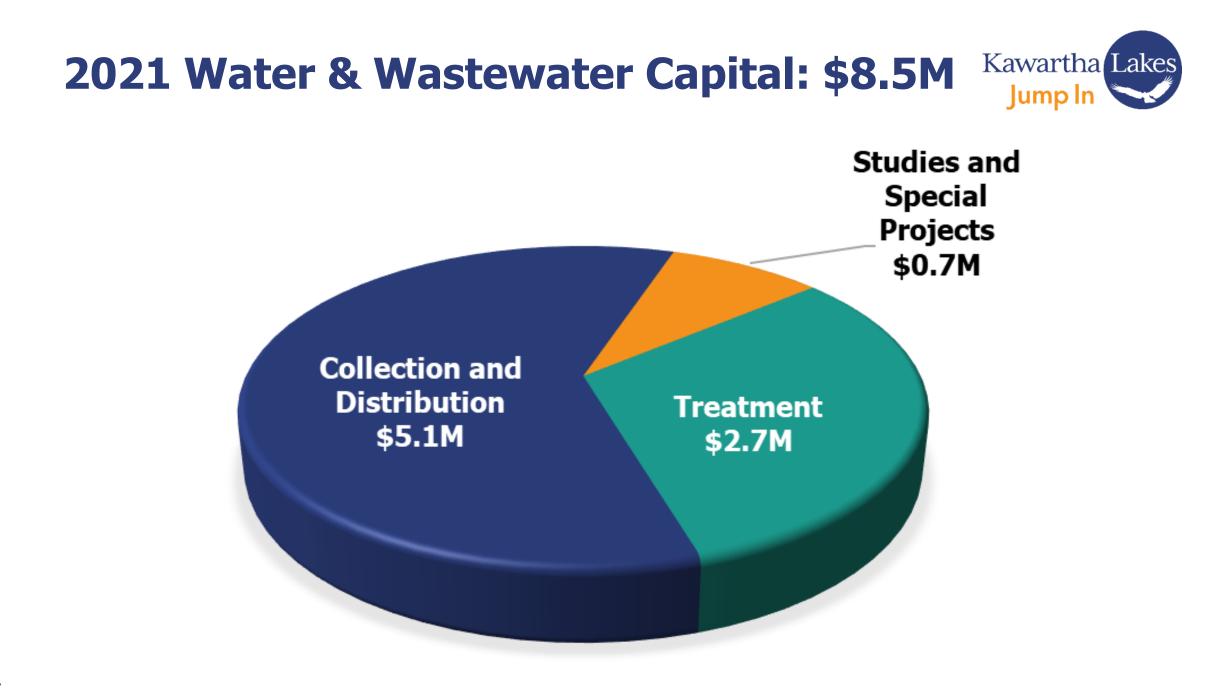












#### 2021 Water & Wastewater



- Watson and Associates were retained in 2020 to complete a 10 year water and wastewater rate study and financial plan
- This plan is anticipated to be presented to Council in March, 2021
- The 2021 budget has been prepared in alignment with this plan and proposes a 3% increase
