Background:

At the March 4, 2014 meeting of Council the following resolution was adopted (CR2014-228):

RESOLVED THAT Report ED2014-002, Rural Economic Development (RED) Fund, be received;

THAT Council accept matching funding totalling \$245,500.00 to implement projects in Coboconk-Norland, Fenelon Falls, Lindsay, Omemee, Bobcaygeon and Woodville totaling \$491,000.00;

THAT Council authorizes the Director of Economic Development to work with Human Resources staff to recruit a temporary, full time Downtown Revitalization Coordinator to work with the Ministry of Rural Affairs' Downtown Revitalization Program for up to a 24 month period; and **THAT** Council approve the City's contribution of \$245,500.00 to come from the Economic Development Reserve.

At the January 26, 2016 meeting of Council, the following was received (CR2016-078):

RESOLVED THAT Report ED2016-001, Streetscape and Facade Design Guidelines, be received;

THAT the Streetscape and Facade Design Guidelines for Coboconk/Norland, Fenelon Falls and Lindsay, attached as Appendix A, B and C to Report ED2016-001, be approved; and

THAT consideration is given to the recommendations contained in the Streetscape and Facade Design Guidelines by the municipality, downtown landowners and local organizations when conducting future work and planning.

Staff, stakeholders, and residents participated in Community Design Workshops to provide input into draft Guidelines. These drafts were then presented to Omemee community's Downtown Revitalization Advisory Committees (DRAC) for feedback. Revised final drafts were then presented to the Committees, stakeholders and residents at Public Meetings for final comments prior to presentation to Council.

Rationale:

Merchants, property owners, residents, visitors, community organizations and local government all benefit from healthy, vibrant downtowns. Downtown revitalization focuses on managing and improving on the economic, physical and social well-being of a community's traditional town center. Ways that this is accomplished include creating enjoyable yet functional public streets and spaces while maintaining cohesive and aesthetically pleasing downtown building facades.

The Streetscape and Façade Design Guidelines provide a tangible vision for streetscape and façade design recommendations based on community consultation and input from the established Omemee Downtown Revitalization Advisory committee. Once approved by Council, the Guidelines will be considered during area-specific Downtown Revitalization strategic planning for each of the communities. As such, the Guidelines are not binding, but offer recommendations as to theme and style when preparing detailed designs for future improvement and development projects for downtown landowners and business owners, as well as the municipality. There are options to be considered and will be simply a guide to inform specific choices made in the future projects.

Financial Considerations:

There are no direct costs associated with adopting the guidelines as no action is being recommended at this time. The Demonstrations provided within the document are suggestions and there is no indication that examples provided must be implemented.

The City has previously applied for the Ministry of Transportation Connecting Links yearly funding program to undertake work in Omemee and was unsuccessful. The City will continue to apply to this program and when successful the Streetscape and Design recommendations would be incorporated into that project when it happens.
