Councillor Dunn,

Further to the recent posting (embedded herein), it would seem that a *conclusion has in effect been ascertained before the consultative process has commenced.

Off Road Vehicles (ORVs) such as All Terrain Vehicles (ATVs) are becoming more and more of a popular activity in and around Kawartha Lakes. With recent changes made to provincial legislation around ORV use on highways, Kawartha Lakes Council decided that it was time to review the municipality's current by-laws. The Off Road Vehicle Task Force, a team composed of members of Council, Kawartha Lakes Staff and members of the public, will work together over the next few months to take a closer look at the current rules around ORV use, focusing on approved roads and restricted areas. The goal is to provide Council with recommendations based on research and public consultation that will *help expand and enhance ORV use activity across the municipality.

The missive's language is clear assuming the English verbiage written here is to be taken as both whole and complete. One can only pray that the Townline Road Allowance (Hoggsback) between my property and the Buddhist Temple is a miss - as it currently is a hit for the seemingly never-ending ATV traffic currently using it, not to mention motorbikes, snowmobiles, Jeeps, trucks, cars, SUV's etc.

In my estimation, quiet, non-obtrusive pedestrian traffic, horse riders and the like are beyond the noted "popular" activity - AND they are respectful of the serenity and ambient charms of rural living.

The absence of trail walkers or horse riders is a reflection of the Hoggsback being too busy with motorized ATVs!

1. I think you should have recordings done of ATV noise levels & decibel checks - randomly & not contrived and certainly not minimized. Hire a non-biased pro recording technician.

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2. Then play those recordings to your Steering Committee during your consultative meetings at FULL THROTTLING LEVELS. Not turned down so you can speak - but as the ear hears it.

3. As well, play these "daytime/nighttime" recordings via audio playback at Full Audio Recorded levels at the residences of all of the Committee members and the ATV Executives during both DAY and NIGHT times in their front yards or within close proximity of the residences.

IF this were to be implemented, it would be an interesting process as it truly would shine the light on a side of the equation that is never tabled or contemplated.

Good afternoon Mayor and Council.

It was very disappointing to see Pat Dunn eviscerate item 9.3.29 at Councill yesterday.

Item 9.3.29

CW2021-216

 That Report PW2021-004, Off Road Vehicle Task Force Recommendations, be received;

That the linkage route for ATV's through the urban area of Lindsay proposed by the Off Road Vehicle Use of City Roads Task Force not be approved;

That the Off Road Vehicle Use of City Roads Task Force review and report back on bypass options for an ATV route around Lindsay to link the north and south trails; and **That** the by-pass option(s) include a bridge crossing at Thunderbridge Road.

The component of this item was: "**That** the linkage route for ATV's through the urban area of Lindsay proposed by the Off Road Vehicle Use of City Roads Task Force not be approved"

Council voted to eliminate that part of the recommendation from the modified motion set forth by Pat Dunn, when that part of the motion was in fact the key issue discussed at the

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Committee of the Whole. Kudos to Pat Dunn for this sly maneuvering, but Mr Mayor and Council, please don't lose sight of the fact that 66.4% of those responding to the survey said NO TO ATVS ON LINDSAY STREETS"

I Would hope that one of you councillors would re-introduce a motion at the next Committee of the Whole to cover the removed clause: That the linkage route for ATV's through the urban area of Lindsay proposed by the Off Road Vehicle Use of City Roads Task Force not be approve.

I have no idea why Pat Dunn is so bound and determined to get a road access through Lindsay when he hasn't taken the time to go door to door and ask his constituents what they feel about his recommendation, after all, these are the people who will either vote for him in November or vote for anyone else to runs against him. When Pat Dunn was asked what his constituent wanted, his reply was "I have no idea". Instead, he continues to cozy up to KATVA, I wonder what the driving force there could really be.

Not sure how many of you got a chance to look at the ORV Task Force meeting video, but it's obvious that the Task Force has one objective in mind. That is to open all roads in the CKL to the ATV crowd.

At one point in that meeting Councillor Richardson admitted that residence in her ward and also Councillor Ashmore's ward are already flaunty the current by-laws and riding their units on area roads.

I actually saw this 1st hand in Omemee on Saturday Sept 11, 2021, with someone who admitted to me he didn't have a drivers license and when I looked at his unit it didn't have a license plate so obviously he would have insurance. This gentlemen got on his unit rode to Mary Street West and than turned right onto Hwy 7 and headed east on Hwy 7.

Is the council going to reward these ATV users for bad behaviour.

Councillor Dunn stresses that it's only a 2 year trial period, but lets all be honest with each other. The trail period will never be reviewed and we will just open up the CKL south of HWY 8 to all ATV users. How about we try this: have a 2 year trail period as it is and provided there are no reported infractions of the current by-law or accidents in the area, then we reconsider whether to open roads for ATV riders.

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In my opinion Mr Stuart Bothwell had it right, it's time to cancel the ATV Task Force and stop wasting CKL resources.

One last point, did you notice that the 2 new members of the Task Force are also ATV users, I am sure that goes against the instructions issue by council on June 14,2021, but is another example of Pat Dunn's push to have ATVs on city streets. Again I have to ask. Pat Dunn, what's in it for you? What's motivating you to go against the will of your constituents?
