# Introduction

## Welcome to the inaugural 2021 Kawartha Lakes Business Count.

This survey provides a snapshot of the Kawartha Lakes business community and will help better understand and strengthen the local economy, as well as inform policies and programs. The project provides a unique level of detail to:

- 1. Provide improved regional employment and workforce data
- 2. Assist in making informed decisions related to job and economic growth
- 3. Enhance communication channels between businesses and the municipality

This project is led by the City of Kawartha Lakes in partnership with the Bobcaygeon & Area Chamber of Commerce, Coboconk, Norland & Area Chamber of Commerce, Fenelon Falls & District Chamber of Commerce and the Lindsay & District Chamber of Commerce.

# Methodology

As the inaugural Kawartha Lakes Business Count survey, the survey was scoped to the specific geographies of downtowns and industrial areas throughout the municipality. These areas were chosen to pilot the survey methodology in preparation for expanding the survey area in future years.

The survey was conducted in August 2021 by a team of Summer Students from the City of Kawartha Lakes and local Chambers of Commerce. The survey was delivered in-person, following pandemic protocols, by phone and online by methodically going door-to-door to each property in the survey areas gathering information wherever possible. While the survey team focused on the specific geographies of downtowns and industrial areas, the survey was also available online for any business in Kawartha Lakes to complete.

The survey data was collated, analysed, and the aggregated survey findings are presented in this report. The 18 NAICS (North American Industry Classification Scheme) codes have collapsed into four broader industry categories:

Arts, Culture and Hospitality: Accommodation and food services (72) + Arts, entertainment and recreation (71) + Information and cultural industries (51)

Industry and Trades: Manufacturing (31-33) + Construction (23) + Transportation and warehousing (48-49) + Wholesale trade (41) + Agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting (11) + Mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction (21)

**Retail:** Retail trade (44-45)

Services: Professional, scientific and technical services (54) + Finance and insurance (52) + Real estate and rental and leasing (53) + Administrative/support, waste/remediation (56) + Public administration (91) + Other services (except public administration) (81) + Health care and social assistance (62) + Educational services (61)

## Survey Highlights

A total of 262 businesses and employment properties were surveyed in the 2021 Kawartha Lakes Business Count. Highlights reported by these businesses:

- A total of 1,935 jobs
- 862,528 sq ft floor space occupied by surveyed businesses
- 34% business surveyed plan to hire in the future
- 58% of businesses surveyed are members of a local business organization
- 70% businesses with employees working from home anticipate employees will continue to work from home after the pandemic

The 2021 Kawartha Lakes Business Count is the first comprehensive pan-industry data collection project. The highlights show business insights from the survey pilot areas. These insights will continue to grow and become more representative of the Kawartha Lakes business community in subsequent years as the geographic scope of the survey expands.










