ATMP Objectives

- Overall goal is to enhance the City's active transportation network in line with Council direction and various City's planning policies
- Objectives of the Active Transportation Master Plan (ATMP) are to:
 - Develop strategy for safe, equitable and comfortable alternative transportation methods – walking, cycling, etc. – for residents, tourists and visitors of Kawartha Lakes
 - Recommend and prioritize a short-, medium- and long-term implementation plan

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- Integrate with on-going Trail Master Plan Update

City of Kawartha Lakes is a large municipality with a large and diverse population of road and active transportation users.

ATMP Integration



Coverage Off-road F and motorized users

Design Guidance:

AODA & Standards Developed Specific to Kawartha Lakes

On-road and In **boulevard Facilities** that accommodate active users

Design Guidance:

Ontario Traffic Manual Book 18 & other accepted design quidance

Key considerations:

- Where appropriate, the ATMP will identify improvements to onroad routes that connect trails
- 2. Prioritization and phasing of routes should be complementary
- Continuity of design should be achieved where feasible and appropriate
- Signage will be covered by both projects but branded signage will be part of the trails scope

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Phase 1 Part 1 Getting started

- Develop Stakeholder and Consultation plan
- Pre-Consultation launch - study website and online survey
 January 2022

Phase 1 Part 2 Background Review & Foundations

- Review foundational policies and programs
- Review existing AT routes and opportunities to inform the development of the ATMP vision, objectives, and guiding principles.

Phase 2 Network Recommendations & Priorities

- Identify, confirm, design and prioritize the proposed AT network
- For example, loop routes and circuits, amenities, maintenance strategies and signage and wayfinding

Phase 3 Part 1 Implementation, Costing, Maintenance & Operations

- Develop implementation strategies for the proposed AT network
- > Develop strategies to support ATMP recommendations (e.g. communication, education, encouragement, evaluation, evaluation, maintenance, monitoring and funding.

Phase 3 Part 2 Documentation

- Final Documentation of ATMP
- > Presentation to Council

ATMP Consultation Program

 - Members of the Public
 - Technical Advisory Committee
 - Indigenous Communities



ATMP Task Force



- To represent community members and groups.
- 15 Members:
 - One Council Representative, up to eight (8) Stakeholders, and up to six (6)
 Members of the Public;
 - To elect a Chair and Vice-Chair from its membership
- Mission and Activities:
 - A review body that provides advice and recommendations to Council and Staff on strategy and policies
 - Review and comment on project deliverables in all project phases

ATMP Task Force





- Terms will end November 14, 2022 to coincide with current term of Council; an extension shall be recommended once a new Term of Council begins
- A minimum of four (4) meetings during the term
- Task Force recommendations will be brought forward to Council via DS-Planning Division through a report to Council
