# By-Law 2022-\_\_\_\_

## A By-Law to amend By-Law 2016-144, being a By-Law for Collection and Management of Waste and Recyclables within the City of Kawartha Lakes

#### Recitals

- 1. By-Law 2016-144, being a By-law for Collection and Management of Waste and Recyclables within the City of Kawartha Lakes, was adopted by Council on August 9, 2016.
- 2. At the November 16, 2021 Regular Council Meeting, Council approved Resolution CR2021-532 directing that the necessary by-law amendments identified in Council Report WM2021-015, Waste Management By-Law 2016-144 Amendment, be brought forward to Council for adoption.
- 3. This By-Law amends By-Law 2016-144 to reflect this decision.

Accordingly, the Council of The Corporation of the City of Kawartha Lakes enacts this By-law 2022-\_\_.

## Section 1.00: Definitions and Interpretation

1.01 **Definitions**: In this by-law,

All defined terms in the amending by-law take their meaning from By-law 2016-144, as amended, of the City of Kawartha Lakes.

#### 1.02 Interpretation Rules:

(a) The Schedules attached to this by-law form part of the by-law, and are enforceable as such.

#### Section 2.00: Amendment Details

- 2.01 **Amendment**: That Section 3.07(b)(vii) shall be amended to read as follows:
  - 3.07(b)(vii) Waste, recyclable materials, leaf and yard materials and large items, freon items and mattresses are not more than 2.0m from the edge of the travelled portion of the road to be visible to the collection staff from the road.

#### Section 3.00: Administration and Effective Date

- 3.01 **Administration of the By-law:** The Director of Public Works or his or her designate is responsible for the administration of this by-law.
- 3.02 **Effective Date:** This By-law shall come into force on the date it is finally passed.
