Good Afternoon Mayor and Council of Kawartha Lakes,

Myself Kayla, as well as my business partners, Shauna and Holly are new business owners to the Kawartha Lakes area. We have opened a women's clothing boutique in Lindsay at 132 Kent st W. called The Doll House Boutique. Our grand store opening will be on Saturday, August 21st 2021 and we are currently looking to get a temporary alcohol serving permit for Saturday August 21st. We would really love to serve wine and provide snacks to the public for anyone who would like to come and see the brand-new store and celebrate this exciting new addition to Kawartha Lakes area. We are working with a local winery also located in Lindsay and having our own special wine made for this Grand opening event.

Before we hold the event, we will contact the Kawartha Lakes Police department and inform them of the event date and possible count of individuals who will be attending the grand opening. The maximum number of anticipated attendees will be around 100 individual's total. The hours of operation for the event will take place from 10AM to 6PM and we will expect to sell/serve 20 bottles of wine which will be a max of 1 glass of wine per person. We will follow all Ontario COVID protocols, masks will be required when entering the facility as well as we will request masks stay on outside of the building up to 6 feet. We will allow the number of customers in the store depending on which stage Ontario will be in on the current date of the grand opening. We will also provide multiple hand sanitization areas as well as additional masks available at the door if needed.

We want to connect with the public, advertise our new business in the area and allow everyone to enjoy themselves with fresh beverages and snacks with one another as the last few months have been stressful for everyone on lockdown. Our objective would be to sell the wine, as it would help with costs and opening fee's but if selling is not an option, we would still like to serve alcohol. Shauna and I do have our smart serve and can provide them if that is a requirement.

I have contacted the AGCO who have informed me that we are required to provide a letter of Municipal significant to apply for a Special Occasion permit for our public event. As a brand-new local business owner, I want to do everything I can to connect with Lindsay and surrounding area and advertise our new business in this wonderful community.
