3. Meeting to Consider - Martin Municipal Drain

3.1 Presentation of Report - Martin Municipal Drain

Michael Gerrits, P. Eng., M. Gerrits Consulting Inc.

The Chair asked Drainage Engineer, Michael Gerrits, to present his engineering report on the proposed Martin Municipal Drain.

Mr. Gerrits provided a brief summary of his report prepared pursuant to Section 4 of the Drainage Act, RSO 1990, noting that this report was prepared at the request of a landowner (Adam and Nancy Martin) who filed an petition with the City Clerk's Office on November 10, 2020, following an attempt for a mutual drain agreement. He noted that the objective of this report is to ensure a sufficient outlet for the petitioning landowners lands regardless of any downstream obstructions. Other items from his report he highlighted included the following:

- Existing conditions of the drainage in the area of Lot 19, Concession 12, Emily;
- A summary of the on site meetings that were held;
- Approvals received from Kawartha Conservation and the Department of Fisheries and Oceans;
- Proposed design for a open channel drain;
- Explanation of the estimated cost of \$55,565.00;
- Summaries of the assessments, grants, allowances, and maintenance schedules and provisions; and
- Responses to questions posed by landowners since the preparation of the report.

Mr. Gerrits made himself available for any questions from the members of the Board and the public.

3.2 Question and Answer Period

The Chair permitted the Board Members to ask questions of the Engineer. M. Gerrits responded to questions from the Board Members.

The Chair advised all in attendance today that they would each be given an opportunity to provide comments and questions to the Drainage Board, City Staff and the Engineer. The following members of the public presented the following themes in their questioning:

- Charlene Tanner questioned how the proposal would benefit all properties, when only one property owner requested the drainage;
- Cindy and Scott Haney questioned what benefit would they receive, what
 portion of their assessment would be covered by the City, whether the
 petitioner is permitted to pay a portion of their assessment, if the drain is
 registered on title to their property, and what future costs might be levied;

- Michael Wilson advised that he had no further questions at this time;
- Diane Dilling and Paul Reid questioned what portions and features of the proposal would be covered by the City due to the realignment at the road, options for the ford crossing (including a culvert or closed portion of the drain, and whether the drain has a sufficient outlet; and
- Adam Martin explained that they wanted to tile drain the farm so they can grow better crops, and they needed a sufficient outlet. He also offered to pay for neighbours share of the drainage costs outside of eligible grants.

To each of the questions posed by the members of the public, the Chair permitted the Engineer M. Gerrits, or M. Farquhar to respond to the questions put forward by the members of the public The Chair inquired if any other persons had any other final questions for the Engineer at this time. No other questions were presented.

3.3 Opportunity to Add or Withdraw Signatures to the Petition

The Chair inquired with Adam Martin if they wish to keep or withdraw their signatures from the petition. He requested to leave their names on the petition at this time.

The Chair inquired if any other persons in attendance at the meeting wish to add their name to the petition. No other persons indicated that they wish to sign the petition at this time.
