Policy Statement and Rationale:

In the context of settlement of litigation between the Government of Canada and Indigenous persons, specifically, those persons affected by the residential school system, the Government of Canada struck the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada. The 57th call to action reads:

“Professional Development and Training for Public Servants

57. We call upon federal, provincial, territorial, and municipal governments to provide education to public servants on the history of Aboriginal peoples, including the history and legacy of residential schools, the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, Treaties and Aboriginal rights, Indigenous law, and Aboriginal–Crown relations. This will require skills-based training in intercultural competency, conflict resolution, human rights, and anti-racism.”

Policy:

Education in response to the 57th Call to Action from the Truth and Reconciliation Commission

In substantive response to that call to action, City Staff, all Members of Council, all members of the Planning Advisory Committee and all members of the Committee of Adjustment will be required to take training on the history of Indigenous persons in Canada, and as more fully set out above.
