Background:

The Kawartha Lakes Airport Advisory Committee was established in January of 2019 to replace the former Kawartha Lakes Airport Board to provide advice and recommendations to the Airport Manager and Council on the operation and strategic development of the Kawartha Lakes Municipal Airport.

The updated Terms of Reference (2019) for the Kawartha Lakes Airport Advisory Committee stipulates that an annual report be provided to Council by the end of Q1 each calendar year and to present their upcoming work plan for the upcoming year.

Rationale:

In 2022 the Kawartha Lakes Airport Advisory Committee achievements were as follows:

- A new fuel system was installed. The update was required due to Global Payments requirements that the City have the ability to handle Chip technology.
- Fuel sales dropped slightly, with price and weather being a factor for this drop.
- The last four hangars are under construction and completion is expected for the summer of 2023.
- Minor repairs were made to the apron during the year as there was some heaving of previous years.
- The grass runway was rolled and was used a lot during the summer.
- The Airportview restaurant has a new lease in place for 5 years.
- WM Aeroflight Inc. has a new 5-year lease.
- Horizon aircraft has tested their 50% scale prototype and will be doing further wind tunnel testing in March of 2023. They also have a new lease signed.
- All T-hangars remain full at this time, and there is a short waiting list.
- There are currently 15 planes in the tiedowns. There is capacity to accommodate another 5-7 planes.
- Completion of all capital projects, with the exception of one which will be completed in conjunction with the approved 2023 capital project.

In the upcoming year the Kawartha Lakes Airport Advisory Committee will continue with the following;

- Runway 03/21 (multi-year cash flow project)
- Runway 13/31 (multi-year cash flow project)
- Airport Terminal renovations
- Airport Business Plan

 Runway seam sealing will be required this year as cracking is becoming an issue with the main runway. Taxiway Alpha and the main runway have extensive cracking that will need to be addressed also.

Other Alternatives Considered:

No other alternatives are recommended.
