By-Law 2023 -

A By-law To Deem Part of a Plan of Subdivision, Previously Registered For Lands Within Kawartha Lakes, Not To Be A Registered Plan Of Subdivision In Accordance With the Planning Act PIN Numbers 63237-0392 (LT) and 63237-0391 (LT), Lots 7 and 8, Plan 606, former Town of Lindsay, now City of Kawartha Lakes

[File D30-2023-001, Report PLAN2023-056, respecting Lots 7 and 8, Plan 606, former Town of Lindsay, now City of Kawartha Lakes; identified as 65 Commerce Road and 2 Commerce Place; 1429768 Ontario Ltd. and 1111611 Ontario Inc.]

Recitals:

1. Section 50(4) of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.P.13 authorizes Council to deem any plan of subdivision, or part of a plan of subdivision, that has been registered for eight years or more, not to be a registered plan of subdivision for the purposes of Subsection 50(3) of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.P.13.
2. Council has been requested to pass a Deeming By-law by the owners of the land described in Section 1 of this By-law.
3. A duplicate of this By-law shall be registered in the Land Registry Office in accordance with the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.P.13.
4. Notice of the passing of this By-law shall be mailed to the owners of the land described in Section 1 of this By-law.
5. Council considers it appropriate to enact the requested By-law.

Accordingly, the Council of The Corporation of the City of Kawartha Lakes enacts this By-law 2023-__.
