

# The Corporation of the City of Kawartha Lakes

## By-Law 2023 -

### A By-law to Amend the Township of Verulam Zoning By-law 6-87 to Rezone Land within the City Of Kawartha Lakes

[File D06-2019-018, Report PLAN2023-055, respecting Part of Lot 26, Concession 6, geographic Township of Verulam, now City of Kawartha Lakes; identified as 36 Walker's Road – William Ashby and Joseph McGale]

#### Recitals:

1. Section 36 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.P.13 authorizes Council to place a Holding (H) symbol on any zoning category assigned to property. The purpose of the Holding (H) symbol is to restrict the use of the property until conditions imposed by Council have been met.
2. The Council of the City of Kawartha Lakes enacted By-law No. 2020-077 which contained a Holding (H) symbol relating to the use of the property.
3. Council has received a request to remove the Holding (H) symbol from the Rural General Special Eighteen 'A1-18(H)' Zone on the subject property as shown on Schedule A attached to this By-law.
4. The conditions imposed by Council and shown in By-law 2020-077 are no longer required and have been satisfied.
5. Council deems it appropriate to remove the Holding (H) symbol.

**Accordingly, the Council of The Corporation of the City of Kawartha Lakes enacts this By-law 2023-\_\_.**

#### **Section 1:00 Zoning Details**

- 1.01 **Property Affected:** The property affected by this by-law is described as Part of Lot 23, Concession 6, geographic Township of Verulam now City of Kawartha Lakes.
- 1.02 **Schedule Amendment:** Schedule A to Zoning By-law 6-87 of the Township of Verulam is further amended to remove the Holding (H) symbol from the 'A1-18 (H)' zone on the subject property, as shown on Schedule A attached to this By-law.

## **Section 2:00      General Terms**

2.01 **Effective Date:** This By-law shall come into force and take effect on the date it is finally passed, subject to the provisions of Section 36 of the Planning Act R.S.O. 1990, c.P.13.
