I expect that Kawartha Lakes will have a much bigger permanent population. Easily 40,000 to 50,000 more in 10 years, and the compounding of that in 20 years is hard to comprehend, but likely. Unaffordability of Greater Toronto housing will continue to drive migration of retirees from Greater Toronto to CKL. CKL is a perfect distance from Toronto for retirees - A bit like Goldilocks porridge - Far enough from Toronto that it doesn't attract day commuters, but still close enough that if you need to go to Toronto for special medical needs, entertainment or an airport to anywhere in the world, its easily accessible. That is an ideal distance for retirees, and provide a great quality of life given our landscape/lakes etc. That same affordability also makes Lindsay attractive for those that live on Ontario Disability Benefits, or Ontario Works. Ontario Works maximum shelter benefit in insufficient to actually rent an apartment in Greater Toronto. Affordability of Lindsay will continue to attract more than our fair share of social assistance recipients to our community who wish to lower their cost of living given that they cant increase their income. The Via

Rail High Frequency Rail project will not stop in CKL, but upgrading of tracks for HFR may enable Go Transit to then run Go Trans on the upgraded Toronto to Peterborough Railway - If that happens, Pontypool could be a Go Train stop, and that could be a huge factor in growth of Lindsay and Southern CKL. Day Commuters would have a feasible and economical method to reduce their cost of living/housing in CKL, while also commuting at reasonable time/expense to high paying jobs in Toronto. Transportation investment in our roads and highways is already way behind, and with the increased demand from growing population our Provincial Highways and CKL Arterial Roads/Streets will not be ready for this growth. The Ontario Government is not addressing the need for 4 lanes on Highway 35 South, or Highway 7 between Lindsay and Peterborough. Lindsay needs a new official plan that expands the urban area boundary and sets out where our new arterial roads will be, 10 years in advance. And where new housing developments will go. The best example of our lack of preparedness for future transportation needs is the Colborne Street Bridge over the Scugog river. We know we need it, we've needed it for 20 years, and yet Council appears afraid to move forward for reasons that are not clearly articulated. We will need another bridge at Thunderbridge Road to address growth by the time Council moves forward with Colborne - Can we get a 2 for 1 special on bridges? Amalgamation of Victoria County has turned out to be a wealth redistribution scheme, resulting in Lindsay taxpayers funding about 35% of every capital improvement anywhere in the County. Every new fire truck and fire hall in the county is 35% funded by Lindsay taxpayers. Then we still pay more for fire because we have full time firefighters which have higher operational cost. Lindsay residents paying about 200% more for water and sewer than households in Peterborough. Non-financially-sustainable small water systems in Mariposa, Manvers and elsewhere need to be subsidized by Lindsay water ratepayers. Finally, we will have higher taxes. There is no doubt in my mind that CKL has to increase taxes to pay for all this - Yet the population will continue to be trending older, with higher reliance on fixed income. Those demographics likely mean that raising taxes will be very very unpopular. Economic Development prospects for CKL seem as weak as ever. During the industrial and manufacturing era in Ontario Lindsay attracted some manufacturing business. CKL is not a hub for knowledge work, and not likely to develop given that Peterborough and Oshawa have much better fundamentals for that, with home campuses of Colleges and both having degree granting Universities.

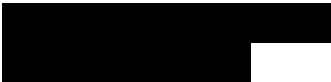

However, when the numbers dramatically increase there can be a subsequent risk created to all users of that trail. An example; The main street in Fenelon Falls is now so narrow, it is common practice for vehicles parked against the main street curb to fold in their mirrors to prevent them from being damaged by regular vehicular movement on that main street . This narrowing of the roadway has subsequently created a sidewalk area that can accommodate numerous people walking comfortably side by side, but is this an added value to our community? When one watches a vehicle trying to negotiate onto the main street from a side street especially a municipal fire truck answering an emergency call for service from the nearby firehall, is this narrowing of the roadway and the expanding of the sidewalk a benefit to our community. If not, then this mistake can be corrected by expanding the width of the travelled portion of the roadway to safely accommodate all the common modes of vehicular traffic that traverse

that main street. 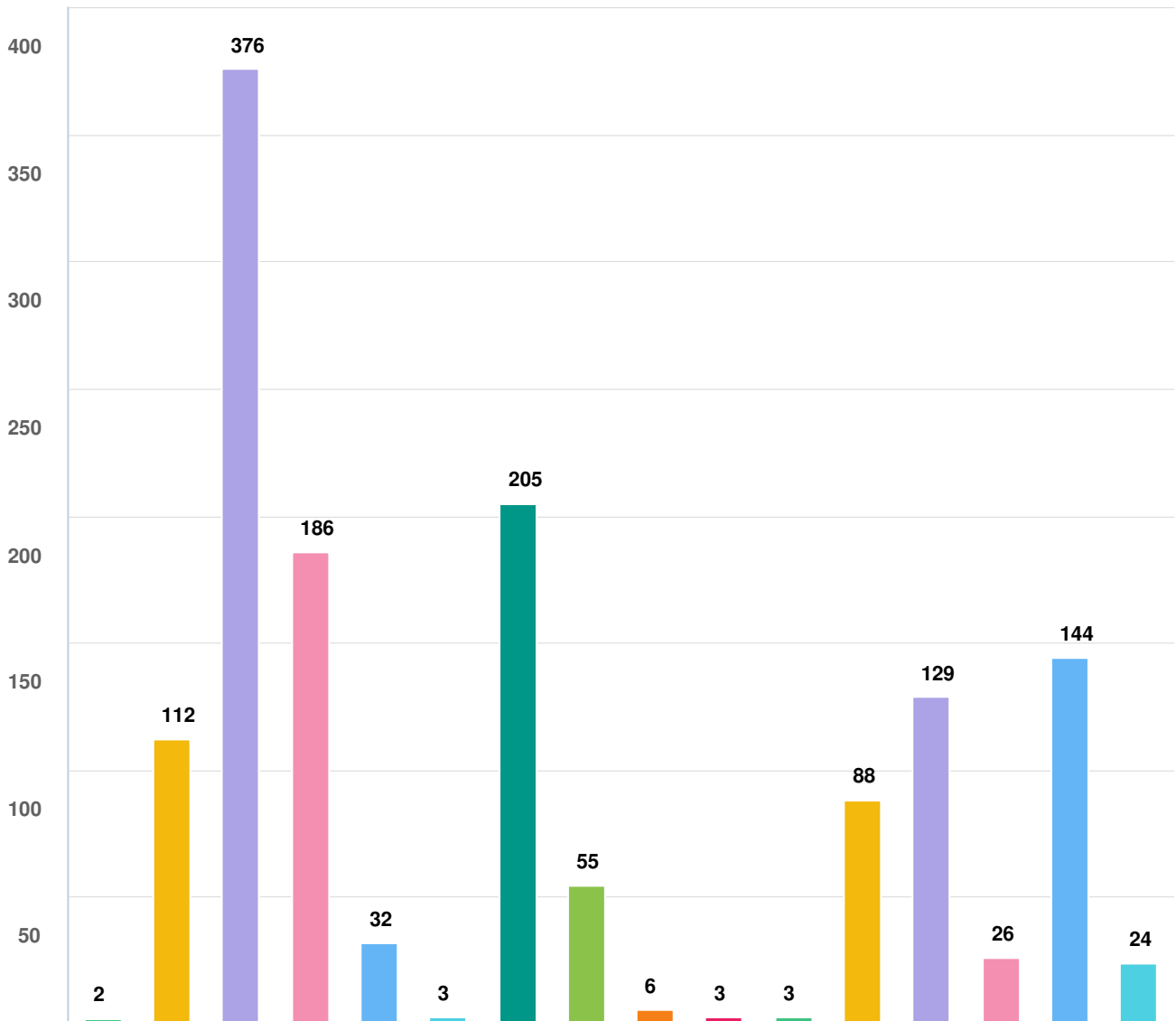

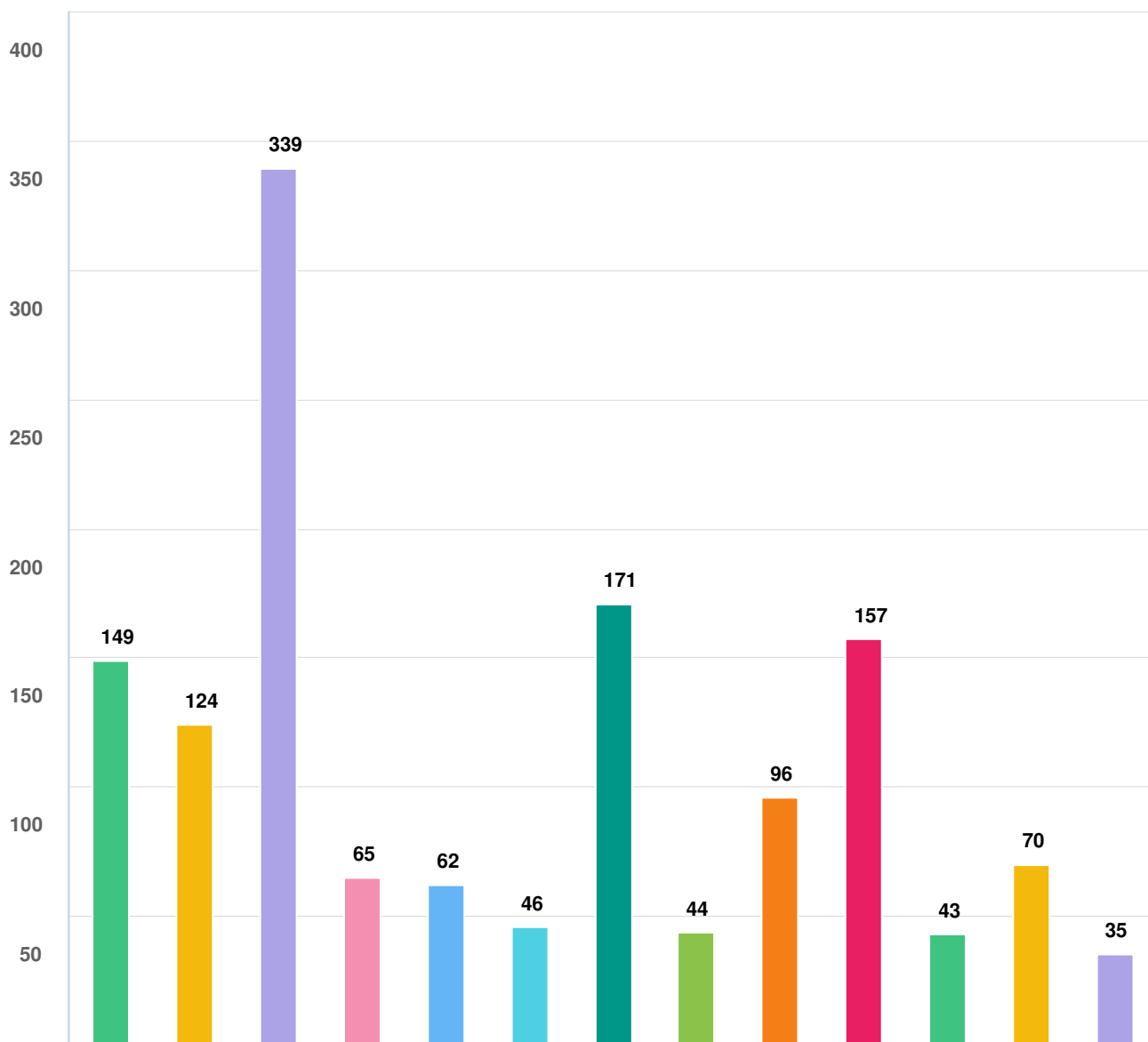

The Fenelon community centre is underused which is a shame. It is such a beautiful facility and there are groups that want to use it, but they are limited by KLPA. For example, there are long waitlists for pickleballers who want to play 2-3 times per week. The KLPA has changed the hours that pickleball is available compared to last year. Last year there were 2 spots available to play: recreational and advanced which satisfied the new players and experienced players. This year there are days with no pickleball at all! And some days where it is just "open" play. Open play is not a great option, since beginners don't feel comfortable playing with advanced players and advanced players want a competitive game which they can't achieve when playing with beginners or those who have never played. The KLPA have listened to our concerns in a small way by having a some advanced and recreational sessions, but there are still not near enough pickleball times available, and not enough recreational and advanced spots. There are still waitlists which means people want to play. There are still days with no pickleball at all, or just 1 session. And the registration system is beyond ridiculous. If you want to play pickleball every Friday morning, at precisely 11:00 EVERY Thursday at 11:00 you need to log in and sign up between 11:00 and 11:01. If you try to sign up at 11:01 you won't get in, because there will already be a waitlist. People are setting their alarms for 10:55 for EACH session they want to sign up for, and if their alarm goes off when they are driving, they pull over to the side of the road to quickly sign up because the session fill up in 30 SECONDS. Also the KLPA only have a couple of sessions that you can sign up for that are for multiple weeks. Last year when it was run by the Fenelon Pickleball group, we could sign up for 6-8 weeks of pickleball at a time. For example every Friday 10:00- 12:00 or 12-2:00. (no stress of signing up every single week and not knowing if you'll every get into a session). It was simple and meant people were playing pickleball consistently. What we would like to see is at minimum 2 pickleball spots per day. For example: Monday 10-12 recreational, 12-2 advanced Tuesday: 10-12 advanced, 12-2 recreational, Wed 10-12 open, 12-2 ladder, Thursday 10-12 Recreational, 12-2 advanced, Friday 10-12 recreational, 12-2 Open. These are just ideas but as you can see there are a variety of options. Maybe the open spots you would have to sign up for every week, but the recreational and advance spots, maybe you could sign up for 6 or 8 weeks at a time. FYI: Currently on Fridays pickleball is from 11-1 only. The gym is empty before and after so there could be 2 sessions: 10-12 and 12-2. A lot of people like pickleball so that is why I mention that. It is a shame that people want to play and the Fenelon gym is empty so

often. Badminton and volleyball are also great sports, and there are likely people that would participate if there were options. Really the big shame is that the beautiful facility in Fenelon Falls is underused.

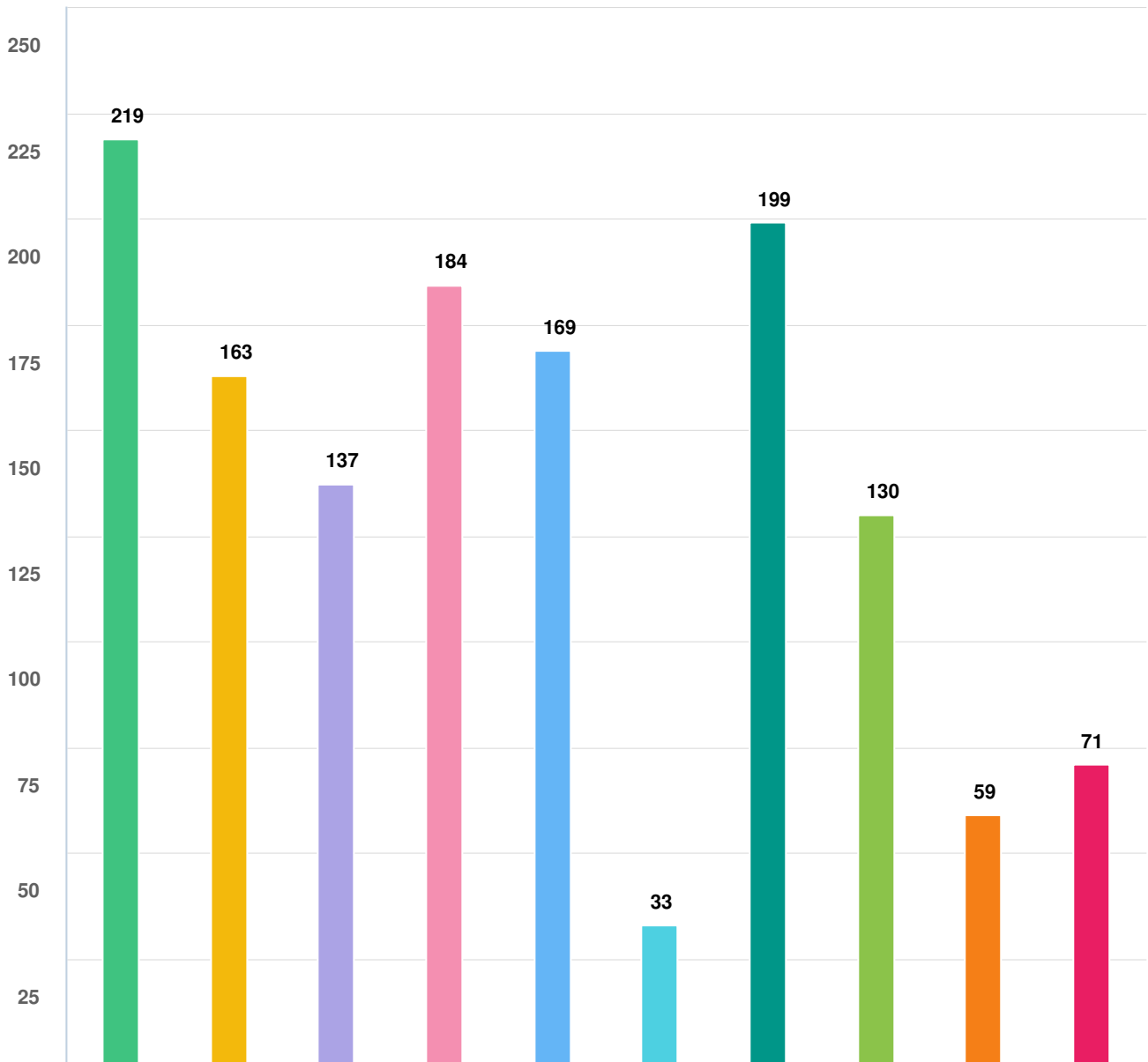

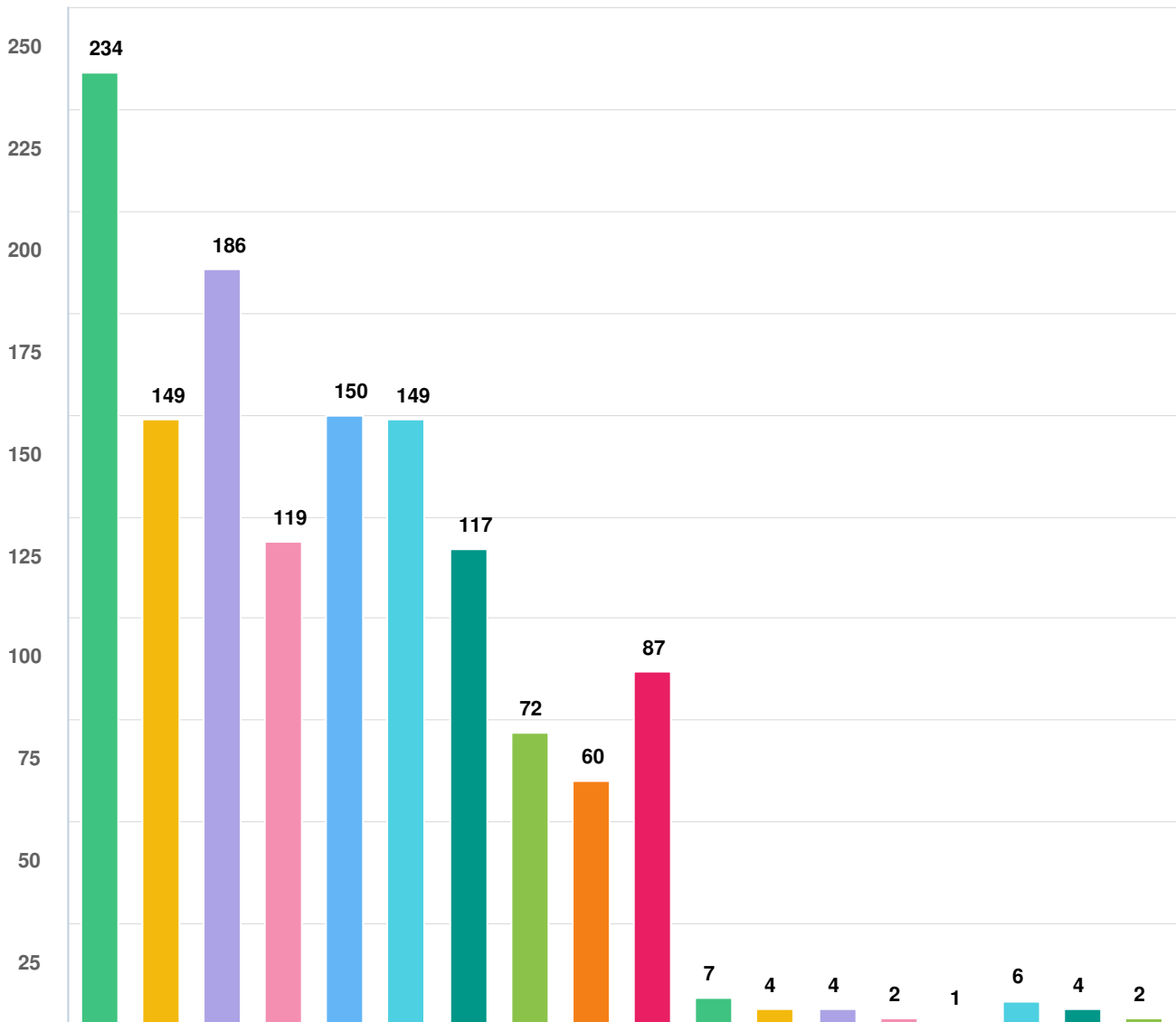

The Fleet Master Plan clearly articulates how the current Fleet facility (Former County Garage on Little Britain Rd) is not big enough for tandem axle snow plow trucks (it was build when the county fleet was primarily single axle trucks). The implementation plan in the Works Facility master plan is poorly thought out and suggests abandoning the facility on St David, and misses the obvious alternative solution of acquiring more land on St David Street and building a new fleet repair facility at the 77 St David Plastics facility that has been vacant and a poorly utilized eyesore for years.has been vacant for years. Combined with the the nearby Hydro One Service Yard, and the adjacent Fuel Depot, this reinforces this neighborhood as a place for community services facilities and fleet operations. Completing St Peter Street would enhance vehicle access. 2. Rationalizing Police Services, Solving facility challenges for Paramedic and Fire. CKL is hamstrung by finances, but willing to fund a premium cost local police force for Lindsay and Ops. If CKL switched Lindsay and Ops to OPP, it would lower costs for taxpayers, and consolidate police operations in the new OPP facility at the Provincial Courthouse. There is not evidence that service would be worse, and citizens could still have a community police board to engage the OPP and have the police force the community wants. Then then unused Lindsay Municipal Police Building could be reutilized as 1. The Lindsay Paramedic Service office and garage which is sorely needed, and 2. Office space for Fire Department administration to resolve the shortage of space in the existing Fire Hall.
