- 3.1 Coboconk Train Station Update
 - J. Wilson, Operations Director, Summit Wellness Centre

J. Wilson provided an overview of the restoration of the Coboconk Train Station into the Summit Wellness Centre. She provided background on the project and an update on its current status. Construction is intended to be completed by summer 2025. T. Barnett asked about the restoration of the interior and what heritage features were being retain on the inside of the property. J. Wilson replied that much of the interior of the original station is being preserved including the trusses, cathedral ceiling, bead board, baggage doors, and ticket window and aspects that cannot be preserved are being replaced in kind where possible. J. Hartman noted that she was very pleased to see the interior design and how it would look. Councillor Ashmore asked if the project was on track with its budget and fundraising. J. Wilson replied that the full amount of money had not yet been raised as fundraising was ongoing and there are several additional grant funding requests in process.

4.3 KLMCH2024-051

Amendment to By-law 2024-081 Designating 31-35 King Street East, Village of Omemee

E. Turner provided an overview of the proposed amendments to 31-35 King Street East. The amendments have been requested by the owner to reflect the fact that the addition on the west side of the building was constructed in the midtwentieth century and does not have heritage value. The City is open to working with owners on their by-laws and worked with the owner to craft an amended version. Councillor Ashmore asked if this was the entire building which has two separate owners. E. Turner replied that the amendment only applied to the section addressed as 31-35 King Street East and did not include the section addressed ad 37 King Street East as they were two separate parcels. A. Adare asked why there was language removed about its former use. E. Turner noted that there were questions in the heritage planning field as to whether or not it was allowable to include non-physical attributes in a by-law and that it would not be once the new Provincial Policy Statement came into effect in October 2024 so this section had been removed. T. Barnett asked as to the modifications around what the designation applied to and E. Turner replied that this section had been tightened up to provide clarity that it only applied to the 1891-1892 section of the building.
