Year in Review

IN THE 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR, THE WAREHOUSE YOUTH CENTRE SERVED 420 UNIQUE YOUTH PARTICIPANTS

- Extended Hours (Friday evenings & Saturdays)
 *an average of 15 youth attended
 each Saturday
- *over 200 Youth + Families
- *an average of 25 youth attended weekly
